

Badsey with Aldington & Wickhamford Parochial Magazine.

The First Sunday in Advent will again be observed as Missionary Sunday throughout the Evesham Deanery. The preacher at Wickhamf rd and Badsey will be the Rev. Canon Mackintosh, of S. Andrew's Cathedral, Honolulu. The alms and offerings at both our churches will be divided, as on the last two occasions, between the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts and the Bishop of Lebombo's Fund. Friends of Lebombo will be glad to know that the whole of the funds sent out from England are devoted solely to work of an exclusively missionary character. Where a priest ministers (as Mr. Hainsworth has done for some years past) to a congregation of English residents, the whole of his stipend is provided by those to whom he ministers.

Mr. Harp, who visited Badsey early in the year. is now back in Lebombo. Writing from Laurenco Marques under date August 23, 1907, he says: "Before I go up to Inhambane, the Bishop is sending me to the Christians at Chai Chai with the Blessed Sacrament,* so I am hoping to sail up there tomorrow evening, arriving on Sunday afternoon. 1 shall probably be away about a week. There is no priest who can go to Chai Chai, and the Bishop is far too busy, as he leaves the diocese next month; so his lordship has found it necessary to send me. After my return I shall go up to Inhambane by the first boat.

I must take this opportunity of thanking the | Donations: many friends in England who have been so kind to me during my stay in the dear old country, and I beg one and all to go on assisting, in whatever way they can, the work of the Holy Church in these poor parts; for as time goes by, the needs become greater and greater. As funds are so low, we shall not be able to rebuild the Mission in Chopiland for some time; it takes all there is, and more, to keep up the present places."

Mr. Harp is only a deacon.
