

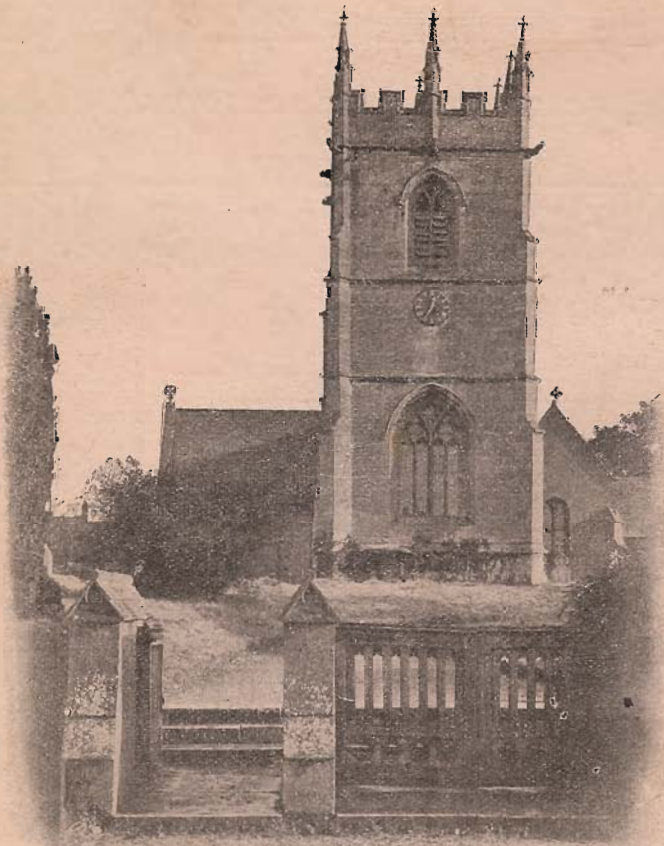

## EASTER VESTRIES.

The Badsey Easter Vestry was held at the Vicarage on Easter Tuesday, the Vicar presiding.

The Churchwardens' Accounts showed receipts amounting to £33 4s. 11½d, and an expenditure of £37 1s. 0¾d. There was thus an adverse balance of £3 16s. 1½d. There would, however, have been a substantial credit balance but for the fact that on eight Sundays the collections usually allocated to Church Expenses had been devoted to the Organ Fund.

If to this total we add £31 15s. 0¾d., the amount collected for Church Expenses, we have a grand total of £70 9s. 9¾d.—a record sum for Badsey, in spite of the fact that there were only 51 Sundays in the year 1908-9.

The Sick and Needy Fund showed a balance of 7s. 3¾d.

Messrs. J. Sladden and H. Keen were re-elected Churchwardens, and Messrs. A. Sparrow, C. A. Binyon, E. Knight, and W. Mustoe were elected Sidesmen.

The Wickhamford Easter Vestry was held in the Parish Room on Wednesday, April 14th, Mr. R. Taylor presiding.

The Churchwardens' Accounts showed receipts amounting to £11 5s. 3d., an expenditure of £10 17s. 9d., and a credit balance of 7s. 6d.
