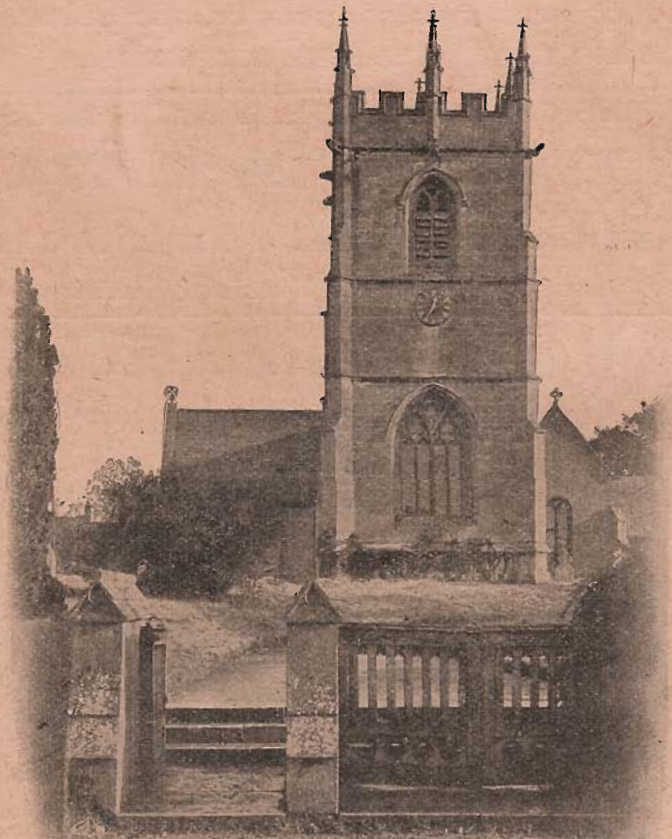

EASTER.
