Jones may, however, be congratulated on the success of their efforts in teaching the choristers the Boy Scouts' Marching Song, "Be prepared," and we may further venture the opinion that Mr. J. F. Agg's reputation as a writer of verses has not suffered by his latest production, "The life they lead us."

During the interval selections were given on Mr. Ballard's gramaphone, and the Vicar proposed a vote of thanks to those ladies and gentlemen who had kindly given their services—especially those who had come from a distance. Mr. Sladden seconded, and Captain Hunt replied, saying how much pleasure it had given Mrs. Hunt and himself to introduce their three sons to his father's old parish.
