CHANGE RINGING.

WHITSUNTIDE.

The Services at both Churches on Whit-Sunday will be the same as those on Easter Day, for which readers are referred to our April Number. The alms at Wickhamford will be for the Sunday School. At Badsey the morning collections will be divided equally between the Sunday School Fund, the Sick and Needy Fund and the Church Expenses Fund, and the evening collection will be devoted entirely to Church Expenses.

The alms at both Churches will be given to the Knightwick Sanatorium.
