## IN MEMORIAM.

We record with regret the death of Mr. J. Mason, which took place at the Vicarage, Wickhamford, on Thursday, September 7th. Mr. Mason, was the oldest tenant on the Glebe Estate, his tenancy dating back to the days of Mr. Hunt's incumbency, and his death marks the severance of a very real link with the past.—R.I.P.

## HARVEST FESTIVALS.

The Wickhamford Harvest Festival will be kept on Sunday, October 1st. The services will be Holy Communion (choral) at 9.30 and Evensong at 6.30 when the preacher will be the Rev. H. Wilkinson, Vicar of Crophorne. The collections will be given to the Evesham Cottage Hospital.

At Badsey the Harvest Festival will be kept on Sunday, October 8th. There will, as usual, be celebrations of the Holy Communion at 7, 8, and mid-day, Mattins at 11 and Evensong at 6.30. The alms at 7 and 8 will be devoted to the Sick and Needy Fund and the collections 11 and 6.30 will be for Church Expenses.

The Vicar and Churchwardens of Badsey have found it hard to resist an appeal from the Secretary of the Cottage Hospital for a share of the Harvest Festival Collections, and another from the Secretary to the Bishop's Church Extension Fund asking for the collections on October 15th. They trust, however, there will be no diminution in the thank-offerings merely because they are for parochial objects, for the larger the collections at the Harvest Festival the sooner will the liabilities of the current year be met, and the better prospect will there be of devoting a Sunday's collections before the end of the year (i.e. before Easter) to each of the deserving objects above-mentioned.
