HARVEST FESTIVAL.

The Harvest Festival was kept at Badsey on S. Michael and All Angels' Day. The congregations at Mattins and Evensong were good, but the number of communicants was far below the average of the last nine years. The collections were also about 1/- less than last year's, and last year's were considerably below the previous best. We were however, able to send a larger consignment (11) cwt.) of fruit and vegetables to the Christ Church Mission than ever before, chiefly owing to the good offices of the following in contributing produce packed ready for transit: Messrs. J. E. Knight, E. Ballard, J. Addis, E. Roberts, G. Jones, H. Bett, H. Keen, W. Bennett, senr., A. E. Jones, W. Mustoe, J. Sladden, E. Mustoe, W. Knight, and the Vicar. Mr. T. Marshall kindly collected the various lots and took them to the station.

The Rev. H, A. Holmes, M.A., Assistant-Curate of Evesham, preached a thoughtful sermon at Evensong on "The Work of the Angels in Grace and Nature."
