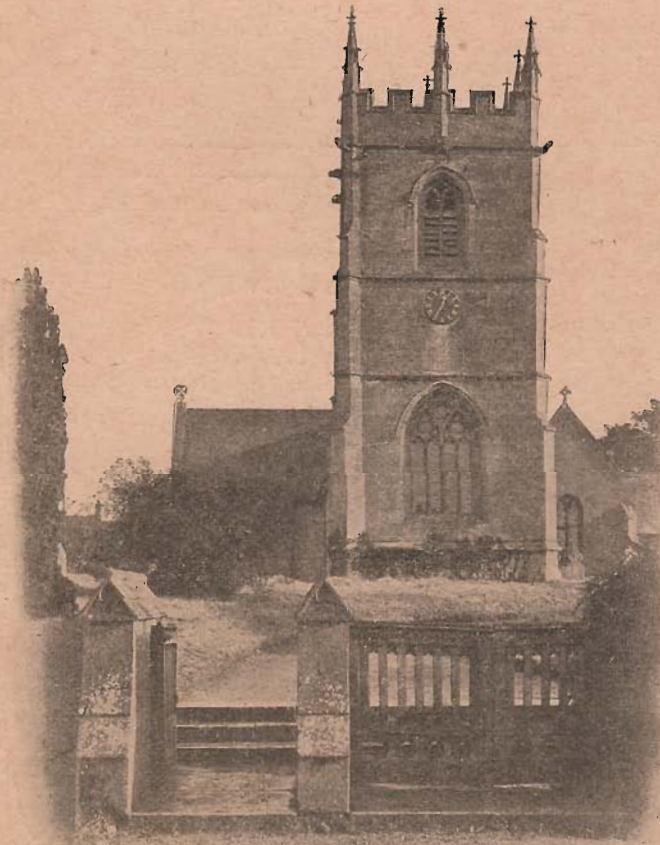

NOTES AND NEWS.

Mrs. Hands has forwarded to the Secretary of the Bishop of Worcester's Church Extension Fund the sum of £2 1s. 7d., of which £1 9s. 11d. was collected in Badsey and 11s. 8d. in Wickhamford.

The total number of communicants at Christmas was 145, viz., 132 at Badsey and 13 at Wickhamford.

It is remarkable that on Christmas Day itself there were exactly as many communicants at Badsey as on the previous Christmas Day, viz., 118.

Flowers for the altar and chancel were received from Mr. J. Marshall and the Manor House Boys.

At the close of the lecture, which will be illustrated with lantern slides, there will be a collection for the funds of the Mission.
