## G.F.S.

A sale of work in connection with the Girls' Friendly Society was held in the Wickhamford Parish Room on May 26, the articles offered for sale being for the most part the work of members and candidates belonging to the Wickhamford section of the Evesham Branch. The sale was organised by Mrs. Drysdale, the energetic secretary of the Evesham Branch, and was opened by Mrs. Lees-Milne. All the girls had worked very hard to make the affair a success and were rewarded by a good attendance of parishioners and other friends who left behind them between £9 and £10 in hard cash. Out of the proceeds £1 was given to the new Worcester Diocesan G.F.S. Lodge (the Evesham "branch purse," by the way, was presented by Miss Marjorie Pethard on the occasion of the laying of the foundation-stone) and, after providing for the working of the Wickhamford section, the balance will be devoted to the fund that is being raised to provide a piano for the Wickhamford Parish Room.
