THE HARVEST FESTIVAL.

The Harvest Festival will be observed at Badsey on Sunday, October 4th, and at Wickhamford on Sunday, October 11th. The services at Badsey will be Holy Communion at 7, 8, 9 and mid-day, Mattins and Litany at 11, and Evensong at 6-30. At Wickhamford there will be Holy Communion at 8-30, and Evensong at 6-30. The preacher at Wickhamford will be the Rev. Dr. Walker, Vicar of Evesham and Rural Dean. The collections at both churches will be given to the Evesham Cottage Hospital.

HOMES FOR SOLDIERS' FAMILIES.

As the "married quarters" in barracks are required for the accommodation of troops, the authorities are anxious to hear of comfortable cottages in the country which could be let, furnished or unfurnished, to the wives of men at the front, or where such wives, or wives and children, could be taken in with or without board. For board and lodging in a furnished cottage a woman would be able to pay from 8/- to 10/- per week, with extra payments in proportion for children.

Parishioners desirous of letting cottages or rooms should communicate at once with the Vicar, giving particulars of accommodation and terms.
