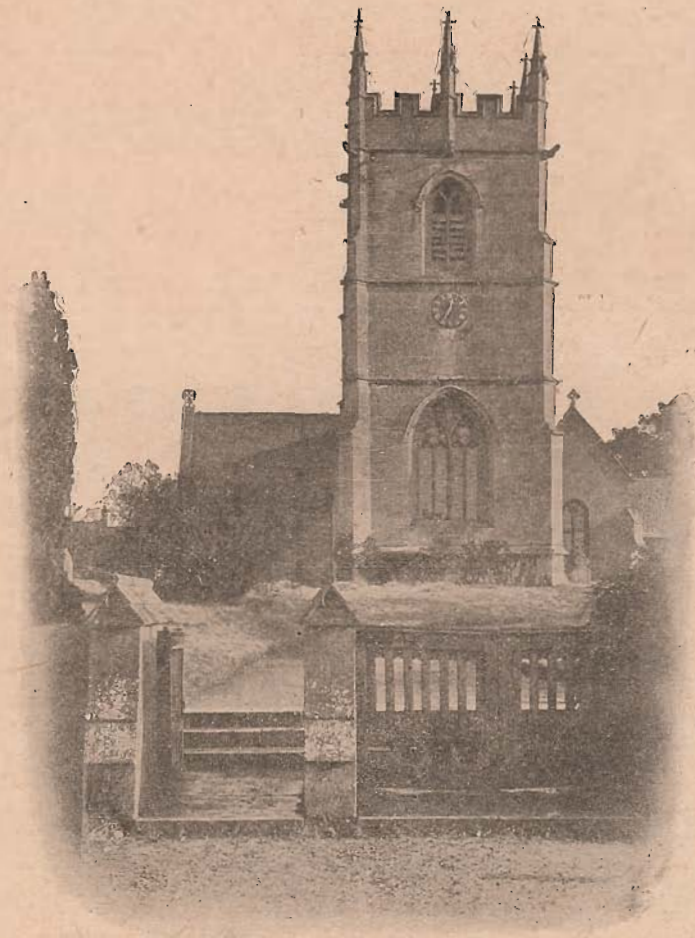

Such places as they provide are a perfect God-send to soldiers who try to lead a straight life. . . . When the temporary tent erected at Norton was wrecked about a month ago, the Y.M.C.A. at once built a more substantial one at a cost of £300."

Mr. G. Moisey is making a house-to-house collection for the Badsey Clock Fund.
