

EASTER VESTRIES.

The Badsey Easter Vestry was held in the ance sheet of the Sick and Needy Fund. Old School on April 10th, at 8-30 p.m.

The Churchwardens' Accounts, presented by Mr. Sladden, showed receipts amounting to £40 15s. 4d., of which sum £37 17s. 7d. came from Church Collections. This year's expenses, a sum mary of which we give below, amounted to £42 17s. 10d., and there was a deficit of £2 2s. 6d.

THE WAR.

Mr. J. Barnard, of Althorpe and formerly of Badsey, has been officially informed that his only son, Cpl. W. Barnard of the Lincolns, who has been missing since July 1, must now be assumed to have been killed in action on or since that date. Mr. and Mrs. Barnard have the sympathy of their many friends in Badsey.

Our readers will also have heard with regret of the death of Lieut. H. Gaukroger. Lieut Gaukroger volunteered early in the war and had seen active service both in France and Mesopotamia, being wounded on the latter front over a year ago. He went out again to France in March, before he had thoroughly recovered from the effects of his wound, and was reported as missing on April 2 and afterwards as killed-in-action on that date.

Sergt. B. S. Cockerton, Dvr. E. E. Pillinger and Corp. S. V. Knight are all in hospital abroad.

On Thursday evening, March 15, there was "A Solemn Music" at Worcester Cathedral in memory of those who have laid down their lives in the service of their country. Mr. Laurence Binyon's poem, "For the Fallen," which appeared in *The Times* about two years ago, was sung by the Festival Choral Society, with the assistance of the Cathedral Choir, to music composed by Sir Edward Elgar, Sir Edward himself conducting.
