My dear Friends,

The Jumble Sale on June 1st was a great success, the sum of £27 2s. 6d. being realised. We owe a deep debt of gratitude to Mr. J. E. I have been associated with many such Sales in various parishes, but cannot remember one where the arrangements worked so smoothly and everyone was so satisfied. Mr. Sheppard wishes me to express his thanks to his "chief assistants" (Miss Cox and Mrs. Dean), to all who sent articles for sale, to the willing and hard-working stallholders, and to two anonymous donors. This I do gladly, adding to his expression of thanks the grateful acknowledgement of us all.

On the day of the Sale I received the following letter from Mr. John Drysdale:—

"Dear Vicar,

Miss Alice Cox told me sometime ago that money would shortly be required for repairs to the roof of Wickhamford Church and I should like to help. I am, therefore, enclosing a cheque for £100."

I wrote immediately to Mr. Drysdale to thank him, on behalf of all who love and value our Church, for his munificent gift. It gives a splendid start to the Appeal which we shall make shortly. Various firms have been asked to submit tenders for the necessary repairs to the Roof, so we shall soon have some idea of the sum required. The members of the Parochial Church Council decided at the Meeting on 13th June that there should be a Gift Day again this year. This was fixed for Friday, Oct. 5th, i.e. the Friday preceding the Harvest Thanksgiving Services on Sunday, Oct 7th. It is hoped also to hold a "Christmas Fayre" Will all those who are willing to help please let me know as soon as possible, so that we can get on with our plans?

The Competition for the Table Cloth was won by Mrs. Edwards (Evesham). We are most grateful to Mrs. Collett and Miss Nancy Pethard, who raised over £5 for Church Funds by this effort.
