My dear Friends,

The ready response to Gift Day last year enabled us to carry out the necessary repairs to the Windows and the Bell Chamber, and the work of repairing the Roof has now been put in hand. It is impossible at the moment to give an estimate of the cost, but it will be very considerable.

We have received a munificent gift of £100 from Mr. John Drysdale towards this expense, and we believe the many friends of Wickhamford Church will again respond generously to our appeal.
