THE VICAR'S LETTER

My dear People,

On Trinity Sunday, June 1st, in the Cathedrals of England, men will be ordained as deacons and priests. It has now become the custom in parish churches throughout the land for all collections on Trinity Sunday to be given to the Central Ordination Candidates' Fund.

Here are a few facts. Since 1900 the population of England has increased by one-third; the number of clergy has declined by one-fifth. Wastage by death and requirement still exceeds the intake of new ordinations by 100 a year. At least 600 ordinations are needed each year merely to keep the priesthood at its present numbers. This is not enough, for not only are present parishes understaffed, but priests are urgently needed in the new areas of population, not to mention the claims of the mission field. The training of each candidate requires about £350 a year, and costs are rising.

The Church summons us all to unremitting prayer, not only at Embertide, but at all seasons, for the maintenance of the ministry. She calls all her sons and daughters to give generously. She asks more of her sons to offer their lives to the ministry; and she expects all Christian parents and teachers to encourage their boys to consider ordination as a call that God may be making to them.

Bishops in the Vale. The Lambeth Conference of Bishops from the Anglican Communion throughout the world takes place in July. (I hope in the July number to find space to write about the Conference itself). In the meantime the people of England will be provided with a 'visual aid' to the meaning of the worldwide Church—in the persons of the overseas bishops themselves. A certain number have been allotted to each English diocese; in Worcester we are to welcome the Bishops of Adelaide (Australia), the Assistant Bishop in the Sudan (a black African bishop), and the Bishop of Fulham (who was Bishop of Gambia in West Africa, and now has the care of all the Anglican congregations in Northern Europe, including Moscow).

Our big day for greeting the Bishops in the Vale of Evesham is **Saturday, June 21st.** It will begin with a choral celebration of the Holy Communion in All Saints' Church, at **9-15 a.m.** The preacher will be the Bishop of Fulham. At **6-30 p.m.** the Abbey Bells will ring out as a great procession of witness leaves the Savoy Hall, marching through the town to the Abbey Park. It will comprise the choirs and congregations of all the parishes in the Rural Deanery (including of course Badsey and Wickhamford). Then, in the Park, a Pageant will be presented, portraying the Birth, Death and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Some of you are taking part as players, and the

choirs will be providing the music. We shall then be addressed by the visiting Bishops. I am sure Badsey and Wickhamford people will want to play an effective part in this great act of worship and witness, which will draw together the churches of the Vale in spiritual fellowship. not only with each other but with the worldwide Anglican Church.

Special coaches will be arranged for both morning and evening events, and you are asked to put down your name early on the list in the church porch.

During the last week of June there are the Badsey Church Fete and Wickhamford Patronal Festival. See the separate parochial notes for these.

I intend, whenever possible, to take Thursday as a day off from parochial duties, I shall of course be available for urgent calls, such as serious illnesses or deaths.
