#### THE VICAR'S LETTER

My Dear People,

As the darkest month approaches, the Christian Year bursts upon us with the Advent message to awake. We are to put off the works of darkness. so that we may be ready, as children of light, to receive Our Lord when He comes. It is unfortunate that this very season is the time of year when we have to bustle and busy ourselves about material things more than at any other. "Come, Lord Jesus, come !" was the fervent prayer of the early Church. "But when the Son of Man cometh, shall He find faith on the earth?" If he comes now, as well He may, what faith will He find-in this Christian country, in these parishes? He will find people's minds greatly concerned with preparations for 'Xmas'. I wonder what the Lord Christ thinks of some of our 'preparations'.

With what sort of preparations will you be occupied, and for what will you be preparing? You pray, every day no doubt, 'Thy Kingdom come'. Is the sincerity of this prayer borne out in your life and the things that you care about? Ask yourself during Adyent, 'Do I really want Christ and His Kingdom to come—immediately?"

"Behold I stand at the door and knock". In Advent we prepare for the Feast of Christ's Nativity, to thank God for His first Coming in human flesh. We prepare for His second Coming in judgement on the clouds of heaven. We prepare for His lowly entrance into our hearts in the Christmas Communion. You have many other things to prepare before Christmas, of course, particularly if you are a housewife. But do not let them keep out the Lord and Maker of all. Why not drop into the church sometimes during this busy season, just to be with Him, quiet and expectant? Wouldn't it be dreadful if once again there was no room for Him in the inn—the busy inn of your life?

What can I give Him? Here is a good rule to make for yourself. For every hour I spend in material preparations for Christmas, I will give five minutes extra to prayer. And here is another. We give presents to one another at Christmas as tokens of our affection. What are you going to give to the dear Lord whose Birthday it is? Why not add one shilling to the cost of the most expensive present you have bought, and make the total your gift to Christ for His little ones, on the day when for us men and our salvation He came down from heaven? Yov will have to add that shilling, or more, because you cannot very well give to Christ no more than you are giving to an earthly friend. After all, whose birthday is it?

If you are coming to the Midnight Eucharist on Christmas Eve, you will want to prepare by spending the evening quietly and avoid drinks and smokes. If you cannot easily do that, it is much better to come to your Communion on Christmas morning, after a night's sleep.

Do remember to bring the children to church on Christmas Day. At Badsey we shall have a short family service at 11 a.m. (you can leave the turkey in the oven to roast slowly!), and at Wickhamford the children can be brought to the Family Communion at 9-15. A child's Christmas cannot be the real thing, if the Christ-Child is left out of His own Birthday celebrations.

Mrs. Braby joins me in wishing all of you a very happy Christmas.

May the Child of Bethlehem bless your homes.
