THE VICAR'S LETTER

My dear People,

This month we enter upon the most solemn and the most exciting season of the Christian year.

Early in the month we have Mothering Sunday. Our family services on this Sunday were very well attended last year, and I hope that this year even more families will join in thankfulness and praise together for the happiness of a Christian home, and the blessings God showers upon us through our Mother the Church. Mothering Sunday cards will be on sale at Sunday School on the Sunday before. You will see from the lists of church services for both parishes that there are some adjustments this month, so as to arrange the Mothering Sunday services in the best way possible. The alterations affect Sunday School as well as the ordinary services.

On Palm Sunday, March 22nd, the curtain, rises on the great drama of Holy Week and Easter, in which year by year all Christendom joins in representing the story of our Redemption. We should so much like to be mere spectators of the drama, looking at it from afar off (see Matthew 26 v.58, Luke 23 v.49), somewhere in the back rows of the gallery. But all the time we are players on the stage itself, and we cannot escape it. The choice of the part we are to play depends on ourselves. Is it to be wordly Caiaphas, covetous Judas, irresolute Pilate, mocking slave, indifferent onlooker, half-hearted disciple? Or is it to be cross-bearing Simon of Cyrene, contrite Peter, penitent thief, grateful Mary Magdalene, wondering centurion?

We are given this holy season of Passiontide and Easter not just for the sake of a little extra devotion and uplift, but that we may "learn to know him, and the virtue of his resurrection, and what it means to share his sufferings, moulded into the pattern of his death". (Phil.3 verse 10, Knox's translation).

May the benefits of Christ's Passion and the joy of His Resurrection be yours.
