Dear Friends.

# Stewardship and Covenants

Changes in Government Legislation. We do not always appreciate how they affect us. Last year we received a refund on Income Tax of over £300 from the Inland Revenue. This is the tax that can be reclaimed on covenants. However the method of taxation changed this year with the effect that the £300 will be reduced to nearly £200 over the next three years. This is a serious financial loss. To this

must be added a further loss of £50 on covenants that have expired and a decline in Stewardship contributions of about £125. This makes a total of £275.

What can be done? The answer is with each one of us. If anyone would like to have information on covenants and how these benefit the Church, or details of the Stewardship Scheme these can be obtained from the Treasurer, J. F. Ives, 45, Brewers Lane.
