In place of the 'Vicar's Letter' this month I am copying an extract from John Robinson's book 'Exploration into God', in the hope that his words will provide food for thought:

'To speak of 'God' is to refer neither, on the one hand, to an existence outside one's experience nor, on the other, simply to one's own way of looking at the world. It is to acknowledge a relationship, a confrontation at the heart of one's very constitution as a human being, of which one is compelled to say 'This is it'. This is the most real thing in the world, that which is ultimately and inescapably true.

'God-statements are statements about the reality of this relationship. Of what lies outside or beyond it we can say nothing meaningful. Hence the reticence of the Bible even to utter the name of God, as though one were presuming to fill in the hole at the centre of the wheel. One can only describe the spokes of relationship, the reality, which is God-for-us. One can only speak, as Schleiermacher puts it, of the 'whence' of my life, of my creatureliness rather than of the Creator in Himself.'

The Late Mr. William Bennett
