Dear Friends.

This seems to be the time of year for Annual General Meetings. The meeting will then receive the audited accounts for 1976, and there will be an opportunity to ask questions arising from the Treasurer's report. The meeting will also receive brief reports about the activities of the Church during the past year.

Finally, the meeting will elect the new Parochial Church Council. Candidates and voters in this election must be members of the Church Electoral Roll.

Now, all that sounds rather dry and dusty...but don't be deceived by appearances! Many parishioners are perhaps unaware of much which is being done on their behalf by their Churchwardens, Church Treasurers and P.C.C. members. Do please come along to your Annual Parochial Church Meeting and show by your presence and your votes that you are interested in what has been done for the Church by your elected officers. I am sure that neither they nor the Church Councillors look for praise...but I do feel they deserve our support. Don't you?
