Lent Course

We shall be joining our neighbours in the local group of 'Seven Churches' for a course of weekday services in Lent. The Preacher will be Canon Billings, who was Vicar of Drakes Broughton until his recent retirement. The services will be held on Thursday evenings at 7-45 in each of the undermentioned churches, and Canon Billings will take as the subject of his talk the following:

February 9th - Wickhamford. How can we know God?

February 16th - Offenham.

How can Jesus Christ be the Son of God?

February 23rd - Cleeve Prior.

How can we be reborn in the Spirit?

March 2nd - Bretforton.

How can the Church proclaim and exemplify the Gospel?

March 9th - South Littleton.

How can the Sacraments make Christ real to us?

March 16th - Badsey. Call to Commitment.

There will be an opportunity for questions and discussion at each of these services. Last year the Lent Course was well attended; it is hoped that once again our parishes will be well represented. **Transport:** if you have a spare place in your car please make this known, and if you want a lift please don't hesitate to ask the Vicar or the Churchwardens.

The Church Electoral Roll

All parishes in the Church of England are required to abolish the present roll, and to compile a new one. The new roll will have to be completed not less than fifteen days before the Annual Parochial Church Meetings in our two parishes. That means that the new roll in Badsey will be completed by March 18th, and in Wickhamford by March 21st. Forms of application can be collected from the back of Church and returned to the box provided there, or to the Vicarage, or, in the case of Badsey parishioners to Miss Core, 7, Old Post Office Lane, or, in the case of Wickhamford parishioners, to Mr. Sharp, 10, Manor Road.

If you are on the present roll, or if you are over seventeen years old, a member of the congregation or are otherwise eligible, you are earnestly invited to join the new electoral roll. It forms a very useful list of adult church membership and it enables you to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting.

Members of the present roll will receive a letter enclosing an application form from the electoral roll officer in each parish.
