#### A Message from the County Road Safety Officer

Over many centuries, the Church in this Country has played a major part in the service of healing and lifesaving.

It is therefore not surprising that when reports of death by hunger, earthquakes, flood and violence come from the Third World, a Christian responds by taking action

Yet, on our own doorstep - or at any rate close to it, we have our own tragedies - death by motor car. Nineteen die every day on the roads and 900 are injured. The cost to the nation is enormous - £1,000 million every year. Many victims never recover - they become hospital cases for life.

The circumstances may differ but death by bullet or by motor car is the same in the end. Both are violent, both are tragedies, both are a blot on humanity.

In the County of Hereford and Worcester a large number of collisions happen at crossroads. The accident records show 'failure to comply with road sign or signal' as a prime cause. Behind that failure may lie another more trivial factor, but whatever it was, the sign was disobeyed, ignored, or treated carelessly. The sign most often abused is 'Give way' which is not advisory it is mandatory. It means: Give Way to traffic on the major

We could save ourselves a sizeable slice of the accident problem by remembering that the signs are there for our guidance, information and protection. You may say there are too many. Others disagree - they want more. Come what may, we are stuck with them and we should therefore stick to the task of obeying them.

The County's Road Safety Section hopes to bring this message home to the public in the coming months and it seeks the help of all Christian people in doing so. The theme is 'Look and Live' - Look for the signs - do what they command or advise - and stay alive. No one will deny his or her responsibility to save life when the call comes from far afield - equally no one can opt out of our problem nearer home.
