The month of the Cockroach

It was a few days ago that John Timpson reminded us that not only was it the International Year of the Child (which, of course, we all knew anyway), but that it was also 'Catch a Cockroach Month' (did you know that?), National Breast Feeding Week, and World Environment Day. All of which may be very important, though if you are like me you may be finding it increasingly difficult to get worked up about all these worthy causes. Anyway, who is it who decides which causes we should support, and when? I suppose that most of us are happy to go along with something as vaguely well intentioned as the International Year of the Child. As a dutiful citizen, I did manage to tread underfoot an evil looking black beetle in the middle of Badsey High Street, but as for National Breast Feeding Week and World Environment Day, there didn't seem much I could do about either of them at the time.

O'Grady says...

You and I like to think that we are fairly generous in our sympathy; as concerned as the next man about the suffering in the world around us; worried about malnutrition, pollution of the atmosphere, exhaustion of the world's minerals, social and physical deprivation. But the time is approaching when our concern, which should admittedly be deeper than it is, is going to be switched off altogether by all these special weeks and days. It is getting rather close to the children's game, O'Grady says...

Surfeit of Good Causes

Apart from the understandably bolshie reaction people may have to being told which good cause to support and in which week of month to do so, there is the more serious matter of our own limited stocks of sympathy. Our Lord's command was that we should love our neighbour, our fellow human being whoever he might be. Jesus usually spoke in particular rather than general categories. He spoke of the leper, the prostitute, the Samaritan; all of whom were considered by contemporary Jews as being beyond the boundary of human sympathy. Jesus did not speak about the 'socially deprived' or 'disadvantaged'.

Christian Charity has always been concerned with individuals; with the fellow next door, or the widow in the next street, or the unpopular girl at the office, or the aggressive man on your committee. 'Love thy neighbour' means that we should try to perceive the loveable in each other, starting with our own family and moving outwards to include all with whom we have some sort of personal contact. I do not believe that we can pretend to love mankind; we must leave that to God. What we can do, with his help, is love that tiny portion of mankind with whom we have a personal encounter. So far from helping us to love in this personal way, the contemporary 'Good Cause' whether it be concerned with Wildlife Conservation or Socially Deprived Children, runs the risk of dissipating our sympathies and diverting our love from the narrow channel of personal encounter into the broad and sluggish stream of sentimentality.

Perhaps the matter was put most succinctly by a pupil at Prince Henry's High School recently, when he (or she) added beneath a rather solemn Wildlife Conservation poster about the damage beavers inflict upon trees, the terse comment:

SAVE A TREE: EAT A BEAVER.
