

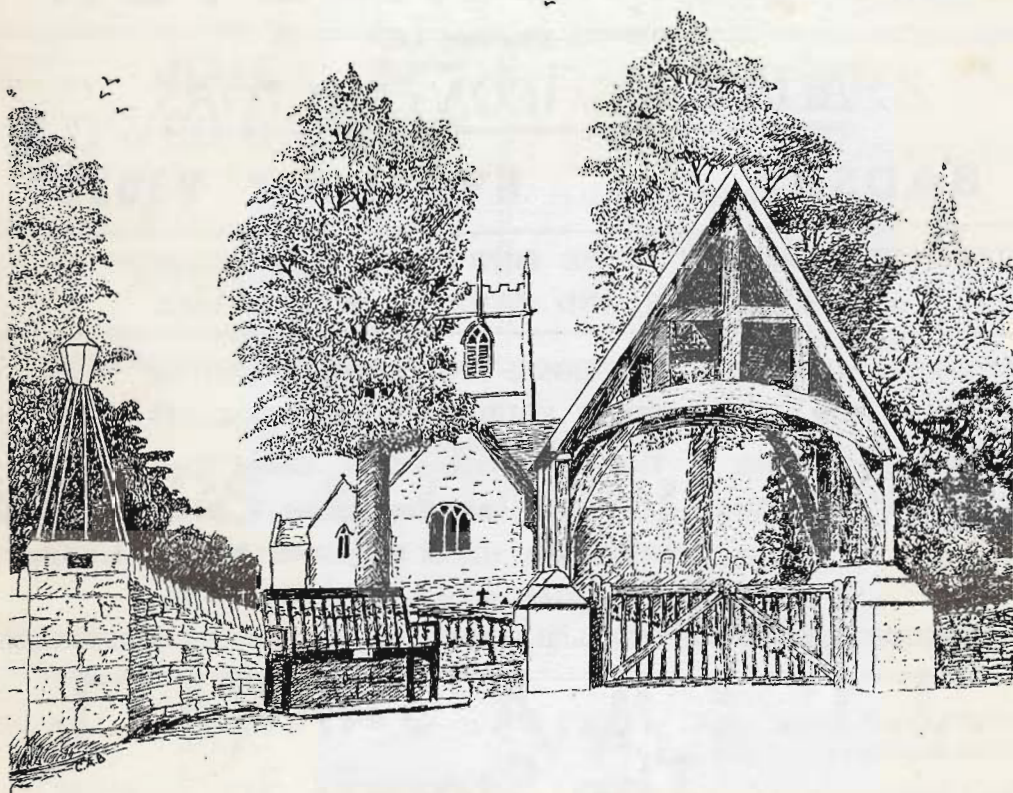

New Services

At the end of 1980 the new Alternative Services Book will be published. From that date the following rites of Holy Communion will be legal within the Church of England: 1662 (The Book of Common Prayer), Series 1, Series 2 Revised, Series 3. The present Series 2 will gradually disappear and be replaced by Series 2 Revised (a similar rite with some minor alterations). Each parish will then have to decide which rite it wants to use, and the decision lies with the Incumbent and the PCC. Obviously, we will be in no hurry to decide; we have at least until December 1980, and probably a lot longer than that (i.e. until our present blue books have fallen to pieces and cannot be replaced). In order to familiarise ourselves with the different rites of Holy Communion that will be available, and so that we can then base our future decision upon experience rather than uninformed prejudice, I propose to hold a special week-day service each month using one or other of the available rites. On St Luke's Day (October 18th, Thursday) at 7.30 p.m. I will celebrate the Eucharist according to Series 3 rite in Badsey Church. I hope that a good number of our two congregations will try to be present, especially members of the PCCs.
