

THE VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Reader,

November and Remembrance

November is the month for Remembrance. On Sunday the 11th we will be praying for those who have died in war, especially those from our two parishes who lost their lives in the two World Wars. On All Souls' Day, November 2nd, we will be praying for the souls of those of our own families and friends who have died.

Praying is more than just remembering

As Christians we can do much more than simply remember the dead. We can (and we certainly should) pray for them too. Remembrance is to recall the absent, but in prayer we proclaim that they are present; present with God, though hidden from us. Merely to remember the past can be a heartbreaking and futile distraction, if it is not accompanied by faith in the present and a Christian hope for the future.

They belong to our future

Like you, I can recall the affectionate voices of friends from the past, that ever growing company whom accident or illness or old age have removed. Nostalgia invites me to cling to their memory and hold them forever in the past. But the Christian Gospel tells me that those friends belong no longer to my past, but to my future, and I to theirs.

Weekly intercession

May I commend to you the practice of praying regularly by name for those of your family and friends who have died? Some of you, I know, already do this, and allocate a particular day each week when you pray for the departed. In doing so we can hold out a hand of friendship across the barrier of death. This is part of what we mean in the Creed when we say that we believe in the 'Communion of Saints'.

Saints in November

Hilda, Abbess of Whitby, whose day is November 17th, lived during the seventh century. Of Royal blood, she decided at the age of 33 to become a nun. Her considerable powers of leadership and piety soon established her as a leading figure in the Saxon Church. She founded an Abbey at Whitby and presided as Abbess over a double community of monks and nuns. Five of her monks later became bishops. Many leading men of her day travelled to Whitby to consult Hilda on spiritual matters as well as on practical questions of church government. Hugh, whose day is November 16th, was born in 1135 in Burgundy and at an early age he took monastic vows. He became a member of the strict Order of Carthusians, and it was in order to found a Carthusian monastery in this country that Hugh first came to England. It was not long before his abilities won him recognition at Court and he was appointed to the see of Lincoln, in those days a vast diocese which stretched from the Humber to the Thames. On his initiative the Cathedral at Lincoln was rebuilt in the new Gothic style which was replacing the Romanesque style on the Continent. Hugh served under three Kings, Henry II Richard I and John, and his courage in standing up to the wayward temper of his Plantagenet masters won him their admiration. A man of simplicity, he eschewed the pomp and privileges of his position. He matched his stubborn pugnacity when dealing with kings and barons with a tender sympathy for children and the poor. His affection for animals is symbolised in art by the presence at his side of his pet swan. When Hugh died he was buried at Lincoln, and amongst the pall bearers were the Kings of England and Scotland.

Bible Study Course

There will be a course of six meetings in which we shall be examining the basis of Christian Belief. We shall be following a course prepared by our Diocesan Education Committee. The first meeting will be at the Vicarage on Thursday November 1st, 8 p.m. We shall probably divide into two or three groups, each group arranging its own dates and location of future meetings. I hope that this course will be well attended by members of both parishes. It is not only for the regular churchgoers, but also for those who may be interested in, but not entirely convinced by the Christian Belief. The cost of the course notes is 25 pence. If you are interested in joining one of the discussion groups, but you cannot come to the first meeting, please let me know.
