Dear Reader,

In the absence of an incumbent it falls upon the Churchwardens on this occasion to fill the space in the Review usually occupied by the Vicar's letter.

We would firstly like to thank all those who are helping in so many ways by carrying on their normal duties and additional ones during the period of the interregnum. It is vital that our normal church life be maintained. It is quite often the case that during such a period church fellowship is stimulated through the need of extra effort and co-operation and we have the feeling this is occurring in our parishes.

Our Rural Dean, Canon K. Blackburn, is doing everything possible to help and two ideas are being considered at the present time. One, which is definite and a date has been fixed for the first meeting, for all churchwardens in the '7 Churches' group (the parishes with whom we have joint services every three months) to meet to discuss ways and means of assisting one another. The second is the suggestion that we might have a joint service more often, using each church in turn as at present, thus reducing the demand on clergy and lay readers. We have received a letter from him addressed to our P.C.C. in which he expresses his pleasure in the fact that one of our members, Mr. Robert Seaman, by happy coincidence had to visit Sunderland at the time of his licensing service and therefore took the opportunity of attending and representing us on this special occasion. The letter goes on to tell us that at the first wedding at which he officiated, the church heating failed to come on at all and the poor bride was blue with cold: (You see we are not the only sufferers:)

His first service went off satisfactorily and he and his family are settling in happily, apart from still being in a muddle with trying to fit in too much furniture for a smaller vicarage. He sends his good wishes to you all with renewed thanks for the gifts.

St. Peter's Church, Monkwearmouth.

It might interest you to know that this church to which the Revd. Leak has gone is historical and famous. It was founded in the year 674 by Bendict Biscop on land given by King Ecgfrith of Northumbria. Monastic buildings were erected and a stone

church built on the site. A strange coincidence occurs in the story of the history of this church. It is mentioned that after the Viking raids during which and probably 100 years after, the sites were deserted. History from that time is very obsure, but in 1074 after the Norman Conquest, three monks from Winchcombe and Evesham went North to visit Christian sites and re-established monastic life in Jarrow and Wearmouth. As with most of the old churches St. Peter's has suffered many vicissitudes and has required a good deal of renovation and rebuilding.

It is perhaps worth mentioning the famed Venerable Bede was trained from the age of 7 in the Monastry of St. Peter's in which

he eventually lived and wrote his many famous books.

There is much more one could write, but it would be impossible to find room here. If anyone is interested in reading about it we feel sure Mr. Seaman would be willing to lend you the booklet he has which is most interesting reading.

In conclusion we wish you all good health and Easter

happiness.
