

THE VICAR'S LETTER

My dear Friends,

Regular Giving

February 1981

At recent meetings of both our PCCs the need for regular giving to our churches has been stressed if we are to meet our commitments in full in 1981.

The Bishop of Worcester reminded us of this need when, in the January issue of the Worcester Diocesan News, he wrote, "My prayer for us all in 1981, would be that we have the faith and the courage to do as the Wise Men are recorded as doing, go out of our way to lay our gifts at our Lord's cradle side. Each of us has had the opportunity to see the star, but do we really go the extra mile, take the extra trouble to put at his feet a gift that is costly. Many of us say the words; "We offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice, Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory" But what effect do these words have on the way we live our lives? Do they bid us to worship, to pray and to give consistently? When we can answer 'Yes" to these questions we, like the Wise Men, have found parternership with our Lord. Let us all use 1981 to make these words a reality. Our gifts of our time, our abilities and our money are just as precious as the gifts the Wise Men offered. In fact they can be more precious, for in our Lord's hands they can enrich the lives of those with whom we come into contact".

There is a real need for the regular giving to the church today of our time, our abilities and our money. Just as we share in the regular worship and prayer of the church, and in the life of its many and varied activities, so too we should share in the regular giving necessary to meet its needs. In the offering of our gifts to the Lord that his precious work may continue, he calls us today and invites us to share with him in his redeeming work.

It has been said the more grateful we are the more generous we become. The regular offering of our gifts should be above all else a tangible expression of our gratitude to God our Heavenly Father for all he has done for us in His Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Our churches both stand as a real and living witness to the presence of our Lord in the midst of our parishes today. In love, in gratitude and in our giving we pray they may long continue to do so.

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Notification was recently received that H.M. the Queen with her Privy Council had been pleased to confirm the Pastoral Scheme submitted under the Pastoral Measure 1968.

The Scheme provides that from the 1st November, 1980 the benefice of Badsey and the benefice of Wickhamford in the diocese of Worcester shall be united to create a new benefice which shall be named "The Benefice of Badsey with Aldington and Wickhamford" and the area of the new benefice shall comprise of the parish of Badsey, (the name of which shall be altered to "The Parish of Badsey with Aldington"), and the parish of Wickhamford, which parishes shall continue distinct.

The new benefice and its constituent parishes shall belong to the archdeaconry of Worcester and the rural deanery of Evesham. The parsonage house of the benefice of Badsey shall be the place of residence of the incumbent of the new benefice. The patronage of the new benefice shall be vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford.

Church of St. John The Baptist, Wickhamford, P.C.C. Report 1980

This has been an unusual year in as much as half of the meetings have had to be held without a Vicar. Partly as a result of this and partly because of lack of enthusiasm celebrations of the 13th centenary of the diocese in Wickhamford had to be shelved. One of the most important events for the Parish has been the inauguration of a Pastoral Scheme by the Church Commissioners in Council with Her Majesty the Queen to ensure that Wickhamford remains a separate Parish. In June, cream teas to swell church funds were resumed, and by the end of September £347 had been realised. After consultation with the Ecclesiastical Insurance Office, it was decided to increase the insurance on the Church to £177,500 with an index-linked premium. The harvest supper took place on Wednesday, October 1st, and was one of the first events in the Parish attended by our new Vicar and his family. At the penultimate meeting of the year the committee discussed in depth a paper by Canon Webb entitled "Extended Ministry" concerning proposals for a local ordained ministry. In December the interior of the Church was redecorated at a very modest cost by a local painter.

Wickhamford Church Kneelers

A meeting was held in the Memorial Hall on 12th December and was attended by Rev and Mrs Mitchell and 10 ladies. We were very interested and encouraged by a talk from Mrs Johnston from the Worcester Cathedral Guild of Embroidery, who will be guiding us through the first stages of our work. We are pleased to report that our numbers are gradually increasing and in order to buy the necessary materials to start this project we need £100. If you are interested in supporting us in our work please watch for fund raising events which will be advertised around the village. All help and contributions at these events will be most welcome.
