

#### THE VICAR'S LETTER

My dear Friends,

At its last meeting, the Worcester Diocesan Synod considered the Brandt Report. This was published early in 1980 and focuses attention on the serious division of the world into North and South - the title of the report itself. In a synopsis it is said that "The report is the result of a unique and independent investigation by a group of international statesmen and leaders, under the Chairmanship of Herr Willy Brandt, into the urgent problems of inequality in the world, and the failure of the world's economic systems. With striking unanimity, the eighteen members of the commission, coming from five continents and different points of the political spectrum, have agreed on a set of bold recommendations including a new approach to international finance and the development of the monetary system. They propose long term reforms by the year 2000, priority programmes for the 1980s and emergency action to avert an imminent economic crisis. Behind everything is discussed the traditional questions of peace and war, and the massive expenditure on armaments which take resources away from urgent needs. This is a political report and it deals with world problems politically. It calls on all countries to make an imaginative response. If the proposals were followed, they would indeed amount to a 'Programme for Survival".

The report is essentially an international and political report because its problems can only be dealt with politically on an international scale. But governments, especially those of the democracies, very much reflect and are sensitive to public opinion. The implications of the Brandt Report therefore are those with which we as Christians and the Church should be deeply concerned.

We are reminded once again of the message of the Christian Gospel and especially of Good Friday and Easter Day, that our Lord came to bring. That is, that man finds his ultimate fulfillment as a child of God, not in getting and having but rather in giving and sharing, and in the service of others. That others too might have life and have it more abundantly.

The Brandt Report reveals, perhaps for the first time, what it means to do this, on a global scale.
