

Wickhamford P C C Meeting, November 11th

Eighty two adults and children attended the Harvest Supper and a profit of twelve pounds was made even though the tickets were only £1. Grateful thanks were expressed to Anne Poulter and Joan Slater together with their helpers for such a successful evening. The Harvest Produce raised £20 when auctioned. Members were asked for their comments on a choice of tree to mark the award for winning the Best Kept Churchyard Competition. The offer of an Oak tree was declined due to the unsuitability for such a small Churchyard. After a long discussion, when nearly every tree in the book was mentioned, the recommendation was either a Mountain Ash or a Cherry tree with our Washington connections in mind. It was decided to maintain our donations to charities and contribute £20 towards a mini-bus for the Deaf, which is the special effort to be made by the Diocese.

In future the Service on Remembrance Sunday will be at 9.15 am to allow more time between the service at Wickhamford and the 10.45 am service at Badsey. Also mid week services will be at 9.00 am and not 8.00 am. The quota for 1982 will be £2000, an increase of about £300. It appears that the quota allocation needs to be reviewed as all parishes become increasingly self supporting. Cream Teas have again been highly successful raising £430 for Church funds.

The Vicar wished to have recorded in the minutes that he had made two representations to the planning authorities regarding the proposed development at the Manor. He had stressed the serious effect such proposals would have on the immediate environment of the Church.
