

Lent Book

For those wishing to follow a series of daily readings, meditation and prayer during the coming season of Lent, may I recommend the book 'IHS' The Name above all Names, by Donald Coggan, until recently Archbishop of Canterbury, price 95p.

It has been said that the descriptions of our Lord are amazingly varied and profound, Jesus, Emmanuel, Son of Man, Servant, Preacher, High

Priest, Judge, Word, Bread, Lamb, Life.

In this Lent book specially written for the Diocese of Blackburn but available throughout the Church of England, Donald Coggan examines many of the names used in the New Testament to describe Christ. Basing his comments on a passage printed in full each day from the New English Bible, he simply and purposefully paints a fresh portrait of Christ—from his beginnings as the infant Jesus to the final realization of his claim to be "the Resurrection".

A careful study of this small book should deepen the readers understanding of the Name above all names, and inspire a more positive response to Christ's question "Who do you say that I am?"

Badsey P.C.C. Meeting - 19th January

At a meeting of the PCC on the 19th January it was announced that the special Mothering Sunday Service would again be held this year on March 21st at 11.00 a.m. Also that Miss Tricia Skitt and her friends were to give another of their very popular musical concerts on Saturday October 2nd immediately before the Harvest Festival. Also it was announced that it was planned to hold a Flower Festival in the church over the Whitsun and Spring Bank Holiday weekend on the 29th, 30th and 31st May. It was hoped this would be in conjunction with other activities also concerned with the church.

The PCC was informed that following the advice of the Diocesan Architect, it was decided to combine the up to date report needed for the work on the Tower together with the Quinquennial Inspection Report due this year. It was anticipated that this combined report would be completed as early as possible in 1982, and that the total cost of work required would be at least in the region of £10,000.

After a discussion introduced by the Vicar the PCC voted unanimously except for one abstension, in favour of the Covenanting Proposals for closer unity with the Methodist, United Reformed and other participating churches of the Covenant. The PCC also decided to obtain expert advice on the possible restoration of the paintings in the church.

A general discussion on the church finances for 1982 followed and after reports by the Social, Overseas and Church Cottages Committees the meeting closed with the grace at 10.30 p.m.
