

At Pentecost, as the traditional Whitsunday is now known in the new Alternative Service Book, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the first apostles and the birth of the Christian church. This year, happily, it coincides once again with the Spring Bank Holiday.

Pentecost was originally the Jewish Feast which celebrated the giving of the Law to Moses at Mount Sinai and the establishing of the old covenant of God with his people Israel. The promise, for that is what covenant means, that if they would walk in his ways and keep his commandments, his presence would always be with them.

It was on the first Whitsunday, when the apostles were gathered together in Jerusalem for the feast of Pentecost, that the Holy Spirit descended upon them. In the vivid and pictorial imagery of the scriptures it came, as it were, with the sound of a mighty rushing wind and tongues of flame that alighted on each one of them. It was the coming of the Holy Spirit in this dramatic way, that marked the beginning of the new covenant, the new promise established by God in Jesus. The promise that through their belief in Jesus, and his self sacrificing love revealed upon the Cross, people would receive the gift of his holy spirit of love. A love, as Paul was to write later in his letter to the Corinthians, that is patient and kind, not jealous or boastful, arrogant or rude, a love that does not insist upon its own way, is not irritable or resentful, does not rejoice at wrong, but rejoices in the right. A love that bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. And in this same love, they would be saved. They would be born again and receive the promise of eternal life with God that would overcome even death itself. It was this message of salvation that burst upon the world at the first Whitsuntide.

Man can still be motivated by many different kinds of spirit. The spirit of pride, of gain, of lust, to name but a few. Through the weaknesses of our human nature we are enslaved to them. But thanks be to God, it is through the indwelling presence of his love within our hearts we too can be saved, and receive the grace and the means to overcome the power of wrong. We can be born anew in the light and joy and love of his Holy Spirit.

This Whitsun, at St James' Badsey, we shall be holding our first Flower Festival and launching the appeal for the restoration of the tower. A church has stood in Badsey for over 700 years as a witness to the presence of God's Holy Spirit in this place. We are appealing to the parish for the means whereby this presence may be enabled to continue. In the name of our Lord, and his church, we invite your kind, generous and loving support.

May his love and his Holy Spirit, ever abide in all our hearts, this coming Whitsuntide.
