

#### THE VICAR'S LETTER

March 1983

My dear Friends,

May I draw your attention to the details of Easter Services in both parishes. Easter, or the Feast of the Resurrection of Christ, is the greatest and oldest festival of the Christian church. It is the time, when as Christians we come together to share in the promise of new life received in the power of the Risen Lord. According to the Book of Common Prayer 1662, all communicant members of the Church of England should receive communion at least three times a year, of which Easter should be one. In the name of our Lord, may I invite you to come and share in our celebration of Easter this year.

The next service of Confirmation will take place in Badsey Church on Sunday, July 24th at 6.30 pm. It will be conducted by the Bishop of Worcester, the Rt. Revd. Philip Goodrich. Confirmation classes will begin on Sunday, 24th April following Evensong, and names of those from both parishes wishing to be prepared for Confirmation should be forwarded to the Vicarage as soon as possible. The normal age for younger candidates is 12 plus, but children younger may be considered in special circumstances. Names of Adult candidates are always welcome.

The Mothering Sunday services are to be held again in both parishes on Sunday March 13th at which posies of flowers and gift cards will be distributed.

The Annual Vestry and Annual General meetings of each PCC will be held in March and April respectively. These are meetings to which all those on the church electoral roll of each parish are invited to come. It is an opportunity to learn more of the work of the church and the different aspects of its life. This year comments on the new services from the Alternative Service Book would be especially welcome.

Lastly may I draw Badsey parishioners attention to the £10 Talent Challenge in aid of the Tower Appeal Fund. Bona-fide parishioners are invited to borrow £10 and see what they can make from it for the Tower Appeal. The closing date is the Bonanza on the 30th May next. Monies may be raised privately by whatever means the borrower may choose, or by the proceeds from a stall at the Bonanza itself. Applications should be made to Mr. T. Sparrow the Treasurer of the Appeal, and all such loans are returnable!
