

#### THE VICAR'S LETTER

January 1984

My dear Friends,

This month, December, has seen the publication of "A Brief History of Badsey and Aldington" by Mr. Robert Seaman and Mr. Terry Sparrow, in aid of the Restoration Appeal for Badsey Church. It is a quite splendid booklet and most attractive and informative. We have every reason to be more than grateful to Mr. Seaman and Mr. Sparrow for their painstaking work in writing and producing this history on behalf of the parish.

History is not merely a collection of facts and figures about past happenings and then the committing of those facts and figures to paper or publishing them as a book. The study of history has to do with the gathering together of much historical material from many different sources and of many different kinds. It has to do with the sifting, evaluation and interpretation of that material and discerning the significant events and personalities of the past that go to make up history itself, and upon which history is based and has evolved. The skilled historian is the one who can make those events and personalities obvious to all. He is also the one who makes history come alive. Who from his researches and studies can clothe the events of the past in rich and colourful detail and who makes the people he describes become real people so that we too may share in their lives and their experiences. Lastly it is the skilled historian who brings to light the underlying and often hidden purposes and patterns within history, of which our own lives are but a part, so that we may see our lives against a broader background and wider perspective and learn the lessons history has to teach us. We are indeed fortunate in having both Mr. Seaman and Mr. Sparrow write this history of the parish and copies are available in the village shops and in Evesham price £2.

We gratefully acknowledge the gift to St. James' Badsey of a new red Altar Frontal and matching vestments from a donor who wishes to remain anonymous. These complete the Altar Furnishings of our church and together with the Cope already used at Festivals were consecrated on St. Andrew's Day at the mid-week Eucharist. They will be in use on Saints days, at Whitsun, and on the occasion of our Patronal Festival.

Now an event that concerns both our parishes. A special Joint Meeting of both PCCs has been arranged for Wednesday, February 15th at Wickhamford Memorial Hall. This is to jointly consider the implications and recommendations of the Deanery Pastoral Committee's Report on the future Deployment of the Ministry in the Evesham Deanery. The Deanery and the parishes have been faced with an exciting and challenging task, if an exacting one. We have been asked by the Diocese

to set up a strategy of mission for the church in the Deanery covering the next ten years. This will intimately affect the lives of the parishes and churches themselves, the deployment of the clergy and the inevitable need for increased lay participation, responsibility and involvement if the life of the church is to be sustained. As a first step in our two parishes the joint meeting has been called to consider the initial report made by the Deanery Pastoral Committee.

There was unfortunately a slight misprint in the letter last month. Part of the third paragraph should have read "Our worship is something we should always offer to God in love, in faith, in trust, in joy and obedience. It is not something we do only to please ourselves. If our hearts and minds are full of misgivings, predjudice, uncertainty or doubt, then whichever form of service we may use we shall never receive that grace God intends we should enjoy. We shall never draw really close to him in fellowship and love".

Lastly may I thank both parishes for their sustained hard work and support during the past year and wish you all every blessing and joy in 1984.
