

My dear Friends,

The Deanery of Evesham has been asked to consider the future life and mission of the church in the deanery over the next five to ten years. Worcester Diocese has said that the deanery must be prepared to relinquish one of its full time stipendiary incumbents by 1986 and at the same time prepare proposals for the future growth and mission of the church within the deanery.

Three informal groupings of parishes within the deanery have been set up with each group being asked how they will achieve these two aims in their particular grouping. As far as Badsey and Wickhamford are concerned this means that within 5 to 10 years there may only be two full time stipendiary clergy to take care of and look after the parishes of Wickhamford, Badsey with Aldington, Offenham, Bretforton, South Littleton, Middle and North Littleton and Cleeve Prior. Such a situation would necessitate some very fundamental changes in the life of these parishes, their churches and in the attitudes of the parishioners themselves.

First it would no longer be possible for any parish to think of just having its own vicar, wherever the remaining clergy might live. The oversight and care exercised by the clergy who remained would have to be of the group as a whole. It could never be of separate parishes as at present.

Secondly, much more of the responsibility for a church would have to be undertaken by the laity themselves. This increased responsibility would not only be in the administrative and financial sphere as at present, but in the worshipping and pastoral life of the church as well. In its turn this will call for an even greater degree of commitment, work and sacrifice, but the rewards will be correspondingly greater. There will be a joy and satisfaction that comes only from being more actively involved in living a life of faith for Christ, and working for the spread of his kingdom both in his church and in his world.

Thirdly, from this more active involvement will inevitably grow a deepening and enriching of ones own personal faith. There will come a greater understanding of what it really means to be a disciple of the Lord, and to live ones life in daily communion with him.

Fourthly, there will come a growing conviction of the power of God at work in the lives of people, both lay and ordained alike. The work of the Holy Spirit will no longer be thought of as being confined to "the vicar" but rather will be seen as active and alive in the whole work and witness of the church and of the people of God.

And lastly, from this increased responsibility, this deepening and enriching of the faith of the people of God, this growing conviction of the power of God at work in his church and in the lives of his people, there will come, almost inevitably, increased numbers of such people prepared to offer themselves for the full time work and ministry of the church. In them, the church will be born anew.

This is the challenge with which the deanery has been presented. This is the challenge which the parishes, the churches, and ourselves, as the people of God in this deanery, are invited to make a response.
