

THE VICAR'S LETTER

August 1984

Dear Friends,

Another very attractive and popular Wickhamford Floral Festival and Craft Exhibition is due to be held over the August Bank Holiday weekend 25 th/26 th/27 th August. Gardens will be open to visitors from 10 am to 7 pm on the Saturday and Monday, and from 11 am to 5 pm on the Sunday. Light refreshments will be available in the Memorial Hall and a Plant and Produce Stall will be open on the Car Park. Tickets price 50p admit to the gardens and exhibitions. Children under 12, if accompanied by an adult, 10p. Once again a great deal of hard work has gone into the preparation of the Festival and Exhibition. Please come and support the church at Wickhamford. All proceeds in aid of church funds. Car parking is free.

Good progress has been made towards raising the necessary funds for the Restoration of the Royal Arms at Wickhamford. A further grant of £400 has been received from the Leche Trust, and £500 has been offered by the Wychavon District Council from their general conservation fund. The National Heritage Memorial Fund has also pledged its support. It now seems almost certain the work will go ahead in November and application is being made for the necessary Archdeacon's certificate.

The work of re-slating the roofs of Badsey Church is proceeding extremely well and no serious difficulties have arisen so far. It is very much hoped it will be complete by mid-September. It was on the 17th November 1981, that the PCC first decided to put the restoration work in hand and the Appeal was formally launched the following May with the Flower Festival, Bonanza and Exhibition. I believe the parish and the church has every reason to be more than thankful for what has been accomplished since, Our sincere gratitude is due to all who have supported the Restoration Appeal and made this splendid response possible.

REPORT OF WICKHAMFORD P.C.C. - MEETING JULY 11th

The Vicar was pleased to announce that we had sufficient offers of financial help to enable us to apply for an Archdeacon's Certificate to preserve the Royal Coat of Arms. Further to the grants already promised, The National Heritage Memorial Fund and the Leche Trust offered aid towards the £2,000 still needed. The County Council Sub-Committee would also consider help at their October meeting. A formal resolution was passed unanimously that we should proceed so that the provisional date of November 8th for the work to commence can be met. The Deanery Pastoral Committee has discussed the possibility of a reduction of one of the three Clergy in the seven parishes forming the Eastern group. It was generally felt that as long as we had people like Lay readers willing to help in taking services it might be possible for 2 clergy to cover the essential needs of the parishes, but with a greatly reduced presence. The responsibility of looking after two parishes and their churches leaves little time for personal visiting, let alone three or four! The active involvement of church members will determine how successfully the life of the church will be maintained.
