

On September 25th the Vicar spoke of an interesting book "The Diary of a Farmer's Wife 1796-1797" "Anne Hughes, her boke in wiche I write what I doe, when I have thee tyme" For a year she recorded daily events: lambing, harvest, cidermaking, scandals, deaths, her maid's love affair with the parson whom she married and her own battles with her bad-tempered but dearly loved husband. We heard amusing extracts and of the possible locations and authenticity of the farm and village.

On October 9th we looked at what has now become a matter of history. S/Ldr. David Williams told of the relief work of the R.A.F. in the Berlin Air Lift; of the dehydrated foods and of the coal and petrol sent in on dangerous missions. Also of the improvisation necessary to mount such an immense operation with, by today's standards, primitive guidance systems.
