

THE VICAR'S LETTER

February 1985

My dear Friends,

The Lenten services this year are to be held at Badsey and Wickhamford on alternate Thursdays during Lent at 8 pm. Details appear elsewhere in the Review. Lent traditionally is the time we seek to draw nearer to our Lord and deepen our understanding of the mysteries of his sufferings and death. There are those today who would reduce Christ to the realm of myth and legend or try to change him into some kind of semi-historical figure about which we really know very little at all. The danger in this approach is that we reduce the Christian faith to the same level of unreality, so much so that it ceases to have any real meaning at all. But as Christians this is not what we believe. As we affirm in the Creeds, we believe in Jesus of Nazareth as a real person, and we believe that his temptations. his sufferings, his death, and his resurrection were real and have an eternal meaning that is real for us today. If these things are not true, if they never really happened then as the apostle Paul tells us we are of all men the most to be pitied and our faith becomes but futile and vain. We remain in the grip of sin and wrong and there is no way we can be saved.

It is when we are called to face temptation or to endure suffering we discover anew the reality and power of our faith and the reality and power of Christ's love for us. We do indeed find that we have not a great high priest who cannot be touched by our infirmities but one, who in every way has been tried and tested as we are yet without spot of sin. In Christ we discover a loving God who does not necessarily take away suffering and wrong, but who, through Christ saves us from its power. When we place our faith and trust in him week by week, day by day, sometimes hour by hour, we find our faith is justified. In the Eucharist and in our daily lives we discover Jesus shares in our sufferings and sacrifice, as he invites us to share in his. It is in so doing we are saved and know the reality and power of his love.

Wickhamford P.C.C. report

The Christmas Collection for the Church of England Childrens Society came to £45 and that for Leprosy came to £68.

The earth tremor felt across the country including Wickhamford, earlier in the year, prompted the Insurance Company to offer cover should a future occurance cause damage to the Church.

The Parish Review has now been increased in size to include more news content and advertising space. If the present circulation is maintained at the new price it will break even at a total cost of £960.

The Coat of Arms has now been cleaned, consolidated and soundly secured after a most successful operation by highly skilled restorers. Deterioration has been arrested and should special lighting be employed, this fine example of a rare painting, greatly enhances the interior of our church. The careful retouching of areas where paint loss was considerable has made it recognisable once more. Many photographs have been taken during the work and a display of these together with a detailed explanation of the project will be arranged at an appropriate time in the near future.

The Vicar suggested that if our group of seven parishes were reduced to two full time clergy, they would have to have equal responsibility for the seven churches. It was also felt there was a possibility of closer cooperation with Badsey especially with regard to having Evensong occasionally at Wickhamford.
