

#### THE VICAR'S LETTER

January 1986

My dear Friends,

During recent months both churches have been the recipients of gifts. Badsey has received new hymn books, a new carpet, seat runners and, earlier in the year a new altar cloth. Wickhamford has received a new Bible for use in the clerk's stall. These gifts and others like them remind us that giving is the essence of the christian life and an expression of our love for the things of God.

At Epiphany we celebrate the coming of the Wise Men to Bethlehem. We recall the gifts they brought to the infant Jesus. Gold, signifying kingly status, frankinsense, the priest, one who offers himself as a sacrifice for others, myrrh that signified Jesus' own death and suffering through which the salvation of the world would be accomplished and new life come forth from the old.

Christmas is a time when many exchange gifts. It is a time when we give thanks and rejoice for the gift of the infant Jesus. The one sent and chosen by God to redeem and save mankind. Try for a moment to imagine what the world would be like if Jesus had never been born. If the influence of his coming had never been felt. Think of where it still does not exist today or where its presence seems to be fading fast. It is at Christmas we rejoice and give thanks that God so loved the world that he gave his Son that whoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life.

We need also to remember the all-embracing nature of Christ's love. His arms outstretched that all might come to the Father. It is comparatively easy to love and give to those who we like and who like us. Indeed such loving and giving gives us much pleasure and happiness too. Then there

are those to whom we have a duty to give even though we may never know them personally and never receive anything back in return, at least not in material terms. There are the poor, the lonely, the oppressed, the starving, the deprived, the homeless, the sick, the suffering, the under priviledged, all less fortunate than ourselves. Those with whom, Christ says, we should share the many gifts and blessings we have received from him. But finally there are also those we do not find it quite so easy to love. Those who perhaps we do not get on so well with. Perhaps they do not like us very much either. What about them? How easy do we find it to love and to give to them? What of those who even reject our love or despise it?

It is now we turn to Christ for our inspiration and example. Jesus loved them. He loved them all and gave himself for them. The sinners, the lonely, the outcast, the unloved, and the unlovable, the distressed, even his enemies. Those who plotted against him, condemned him, judged him, mocked him, those who denied him, betrayed him and forsook him. Those who persecuted him. Jesus loved them all and forgave them. "Father forgive them for they know not what they do" were among his last words as he hung dying upon the Cross. And this was how the world was won.

As we now stand at the threshold of another year, let us go forth together in renewed hope, fellowship and love, offering and giving our lives in the faithful service of Christ as he offered and gave his life for us.
