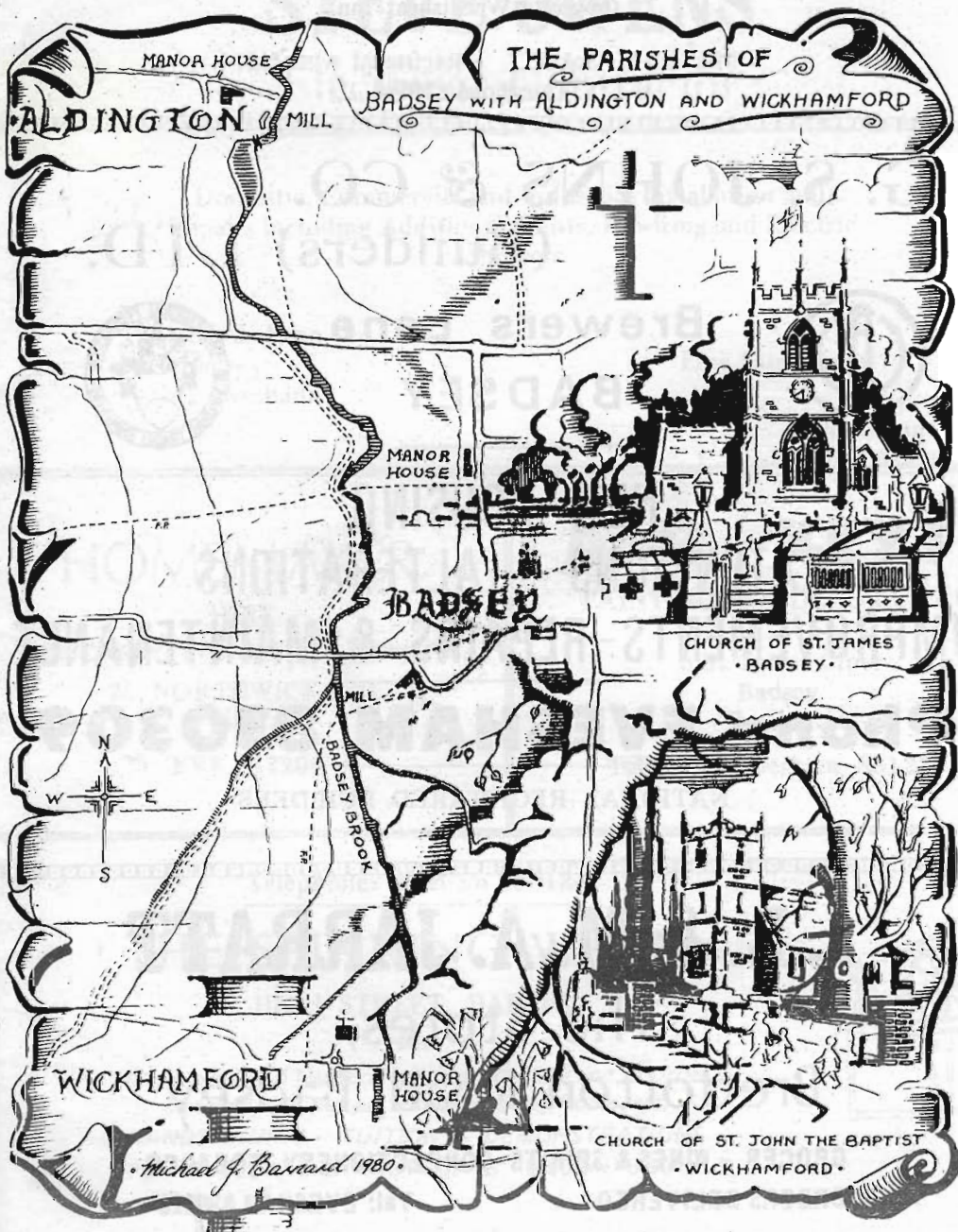

## THE VICAR'S LETTER

September 1986

My dear Friends,

### The Nature of Christian Belief

You are cordially invited to a gathering on Thursday, 25th September at 7.30 pm at Hartlebury Castle to hear the Bishop of Worcester and the Bishop of Dudley speak and answer questions on The Nature of Christian Belief. This is the response of the House of Bishops to the General Synod's debate in February 1985. The Booklet is available price £1.25 at the SPCK Bookshop, Worcester. Come, hear and question your own Bishops on this key issue.

### Mission Consultation

This year the Diocesan Committee for Mission is organising a Mission Consultation on Sunday, 26th October, from 10.00 am to 4.00 pm at the North Worcestershire College, Bromsgrove.

The Consultation is to consider the changes that have taken place in Mission over recent years, both at home and overseas. Our approach to people of other faiths, and those with none, and our relationship with the worldwide church are matters all Christians should be encouraged to think and pray about. This can only happen if we know what is going on. This is the purpose of the Consultation. Each PCC is prepared to meet the cost of attending the Consultation and travelling expenses incurred. It is hoped two representatives will attend from each parish, with the brief to report back to their PCC and parishioners. Those who would like to attend this Consultation are asked to contact the Vicarage as soon as possible.
