

#### THE VICAR'S LETTER

March 1988

My dear Friends,

Last month we thought of the contrast between secular and sacred. Secular meaning those things only of this age, and sacred meaning things eternal, the things of God. We said how the secular person lives their life only for the present and for themselves, whilst the spiritual person lives their life for others and for God.

One of the most disturbing trends in society today is a growth in law-lessness. In the lack of regard or respect for other people, their property and possessions. A belief that a person can take the law into their own hands, and provided they get away with it, then it doesn't really matter one way or the other. In our cities and towns this lawlessness is seen in increased crime, some of it very serious. Crimes against the person and property are reported with monotonous regularity in our news bulletins day after day. Muggings in public places often in broad daylight, old people afraid to go out alone, drug trafficking, armed robbery to name but a few. This same sense of lawlessness is to be seen elsewhere, when otherwise normal, intelligent, apparently law abiding citizens in every other respect suddenly decide that they too will take the law into their own hands, regardless of others. In this, we don't have to look far to see examples.

Sin, disobedience, and rebelliousness when applied to man's relationship with God have very similar meanings. They remind us that acts of lawlessness are ultimately acts of disobedience and rebelliousness against God. This is true even of a nation when it denies its citizens their lawful rights in the sight of God, be it freedom of speech, freedom of movement, freedom of religion, freedom from want or freedom from poverty. But if people, or nations lose their sense of the eternal, if they no longer have

any awareness of God, then it is not surprising they behave as they do.

The ultimate act of man's lawlessness was seen on the first Good Friday, when in the darkness of his own mind man crucified Jesus Christ, the one come from God to be the Light of the world. To lighten man's path back to God. For a short, brief time it seemed as though man's lawlessness had triumphed. Then came the Resurrection. God raised Jesus from the dead, and exalted him to his right hand on high. Man's lawlessness was plain to see.

God reigns supreme. He is a God of love, of mercy, and forgiveness. Man has but to turn to him in penitence, humility and faith to experience the joy of new life with God in Jesus Christ. A life in which man is enabled to live by God's grace in obedience to God's will.

But if man persists in his lawlessness, then he comes under the judgement of God and the consequences which follow. Jesus came to seek and to save that which was lost. He died on the Cross for the sake of all mankind. That through faith in Jesus and in his resurrection from the dead, man might be saved from his own lawless and disobedient nature, to live his life with God and in his love.
