

The Vicar's Letter

May 1992

My dear Friends,

In November of this year, a vote will be taken in the General Synod of the Church of England on whether or not women should be ordained to the priesthood. Whichever way the vote is decided, there will be those who will feel deep and painful distress at the outcome. If the decision is negative, there will be those who will feel rejected and spurned by the church they believe is calling them to serve in this way. On the other hand, if the vote is positive, there will be those who will feel betrayed and let down by the church, and who may find it difficult, if not impossible to continue in their present vocation and calling. A vocation and calling in which they too believe they were called to serve the church, yet which they now feel compelled to leave. When the vote is taken, and the decision made, it will be a very painful and difficult period for the Church of England, and many will be deeply affected by it.

Because of this, and in common with other churches elsewhere in the country, special prayers are being offered in the deanery of Evesham, in the months preceding the vote in November. On the last Friday of each month a short service of silent prayer followed by a celebration of the Eucharist, is being held in All Saints Evesham from 12.45pm to 1.15pm in which both clergy and laity are invited to join. The first service was held on the last Friday in March, and the next will be on the last Friday in April. All those who are able to attend are invited to do so, whilst those who cannot are asked to remember this matter in their prayers, and pray especially for the guidance of the Holy Spirit during these coming months, and for the comfort, support and guidance of those who will be most deeply affected by it afterwards.

ACROSS THE DIOCESE

On Saturday, 4th April, the trip "Across the Diocese" (and county) by train, from East to West and from South to North, in aid of the Childrens' Society, was successfully accomplished. Leaving Evesham, one travelled first to Worcester, and from there to Cheltenham. From Cheltenham it was north to Birmingham New Street, via Droitwich Spa, Bromsgrove and Kings Norton, returning via Cradley Heath, Kidderminster and Hartlebury to Great Malvern, Ledbury and Hereford. From Hereford it was back to Worcester again where after spending two hours in the city and visiting the Cathedral one travelled on to Moreton-in-Marsh and then back to Evesham.

Although the mileage travelled was considerably more, including as it did some back tracking to make the necessary connections, the distance travelled across the diocese from East to West and from South to North was approximately 62 miles.

Finally, a tribute to British Rail. All services ran as scheduled, and within a few minutes of their advertised times. The trains were neat, quick, clean and comfortable and not overcrowded and one left Evesham on time and returned on time to the minute. The refreshment facilities on route were good. The detailed itinerary was as follows: Evesham dep 0801; Worcester Shrub Hill arr 0823, dep 0852: Cheltenham arr 0914, dep 0959: Birmingham New St arr 1114, dep 1130; Hereford arr 1309, dep 1332: Worcester Foregate St arr 1412, dep 1608; Moreton arr 1649, dep 1709: Evesham arr 1726. Once more I would like to thank all those who supported this venture so generously. The Appeal has now reached over £300, This is a splendid response.
