

THE VICAR'S LETTER

February 1994

My dear Friends,

"The Kingdom of Heaven is like....."

During Lent we shall be holding a series of Lent Bible Study and Discussion Groups, the subject of which this year will be "The Kingdom of Heaven is like......" It will be based on some of the many parables Jesus expounded on this topic.

But what is the Kingdom of Heaven? In the Lord's Prayer, when we pray "Thy Kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven" and when, in the Te Deum we say "Thou didst open the kingdom of heaven to all

believers" what do we mean?

There are some who say the Kingdom of Heaven was expected to come soon after Jesus' ascension into heaven. A kingdom the followers of Jesus were called to prepare people for. But they were disappointed. Time passed and nothing happened. Life went on much as before. The Kingdom of Heaven did not come and still has not done so. Could not even Jesus have been mistaken they ask?

Then there are those who say the Kingdom of Heaven will come, but at the end of time, at the end of the age. When all things come to their final consummation and fulfilment. It is for this the world and the Church must

always be prepared. Because no one knows when it will be.

But now there are those who doubt even this. They say that belief in the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven has become quite meaningless and irrelevant in this day and age. Others simply say it is where we go when we die. When we go to be with God.

But there are those who say the Kingdom of Heaven is something which is all around us here and now if we can but perceive and see it. Something we enter through faith. Through faith in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. It is another dimension. A dimension where God reigns over all things both in heaven and on earth. And sometimes it is as though we are given a glimpse, a vision of this heavenly kingdom, to cheer us on our way and sustain us through the imperfections and uncertainties of this life and this world. And nowhere more so than when we draw nearer and closer to Jesus himself. For to draw near to Jesus is to draw near to God. It is to experience that sense of the eternal which lies at the heart of all creation and all reality.

At a time when we have heard much about "back to basics" and the need to return to "core values" we pray the Holy Spirit may illuminate for us more clearly the teaching of Jesus on the Kingdom of Heaven. That with the whole Church, we may take our part in proclaiming that in Him, the Kingdom of Heaven is indeed at hand.
