

THE VICAR'S LETTER

July 1995

My dear Friends,

This month sees the highlight of Badsey with Aldington's 700th Anniversary Celebrations. On Sunday evening, 23rd July, the Archbishop of Wales and Bishop of St Asaph, the Most Right Reverend Alwyn Rice Jones, M.A. will preach at the Patronal Festival Evensong to be held in St James' Church, Badsey. The Bishop of Worcester, the Right Reverend Philip Goodrich, M.A., will also be present.

The service is being held in conjunction with the churches of St Leonard's Bretforton, and St Ecgwins, Honeybourne and representatives from these parishes with their clergy are being invited. Light Refreshments will be served afterwards in Badsey School.

Representatives from two more parishes may also be present, first from All Saints Evesham, representing St Lawrence's Church and secondly from St Egwin's Norton, two other churches in the area now known to have been consecrated or dedicated by the Bishop of St Asaph in 1295.

Although other than for possibly two or three special guests, seats are not being reserved, seating is limited. Those attending therefore are advised to come as early as possible.

This will be a most memorable occasion. An occasion that will link the church with its history across the centuries, a history shared with others, and recapture within us a sense of thankfulness for the heritage we richly enjoy today. The heritage of our Church and the heritage of our Faith. An occasion when we go forward with renewed faith, vigour and commitment in the future.

PASTORAL REORGANISATION

In July and August, the Archdeacon of Worcester is to visit both PCCs to discuss the proposed Pastoral Reorganisation Scheme of the Benefice to which each PCC has to respond by the 28th August. Namely the grouping of Badsey and Aldington with the parishes of Offenham and Bretforton, and the move of the present Vicar of Offenham to Badsey, and the grouping of Wickhamford with Broadway. His visit to Wickhamford PCC will be on Wednesday, 12th July at 7.30pm at the Memorial Hall, Wickhamford and his visit to Badsey on Tuesday, 1st August at 7.30pm in Badsey Church. These are both very important meetings and it is hoped all PCC members will make a special effort to attend. Copies of the proposed Scheme are being forwarded to all PCC members beforehand. Will all PCC members please make a note in their diaries now. The meeting of Badsey PCC previously arranged for Thursday, 20th July has been cancelled.

BADSEY CHURCHYARD

Sadly, there are still instances of flowers and plants being removed from graves in the churchyard, especially in the vicinity of the most recent burials on the north side of the church. If anyone can throw any light on this distressing and wanton desecration of the churchyard would they please contact the Vicar or Churchwardens.

MOTHERS UNION

We had a good attendance at our May evening meeting, when our speaker was Mrs Jill Read from the Childrens Society. She spoke of the work being done with children suffering from cerebral palsy, how the staff had realised they needed a different approach to their problems. There was so much frustration when limbs could not be coordinated. A lot of patience is needed to build up their confidence. On a one to one basis very often. Also it had been necessary to challenge peoples views and behaviour towards the children. Staff were learning all the time, and it was rewarding when a child had enough confidence to join in a skittles match or similar activity.

Another project outlined was the running of a 'Drop In' centre at Digbeth, Birmingham. Here young people on the streets can have a bath, do laundry, have a hot meal and talk to someone willing to listen. So many youngsters run away because no one will listen to them. They are afraid to return home but equally scared to stay on the streets. Here the Society workers act as an intermediary. They have gained the respect of many of the drop outs who will now tell them of new arrivals. These can be contacted before they are hooked on drugs or prostitution. The workers have a close relationship with the police who greatly value what they are doing. It was good to hear of these two projects within the Society which we support with our boxes throughout the year. We shall hope to hear more at a future date.

Bank Holiday Monday saw many members busy at the Church Fete on numerous stalls serving tea and generally helping to raise funds. Thank you all for your generosity, and for your time and hard work.

Reading 'Christian Crackers' in the Review last month, brought to mind a piece of prose I learnt at school some sixty years ago. As far as I recall it went like this -

The Portrait of a Child

"Beautiful eyes, pools violet reflecting with hint of skies. And over them a curl, where a sunbeam - heaven neglecting - sleeping lies. The dress, a Victorian child, anyway they chose a well fitting name, they called her Rose. Pencil in hand and paper spread, tossed back head. Why did the

painter choose that pose?" The story goes that hearing him approach she said "Hush, I am drawing GOD". Then said he "That cannot be for no one knows what GOD is like" Said she "They will when I have done" and what she says is true, they do. I am her son, and so I know."

The guest speaker was Mrs Pat Kearsey, who designs and makes small model mice, very reminiscent of the illustrations in the books of Beatrix Potter, but not restricted to the creatures of the wild, but in all forms of everyday life. There was a farmer mouse, a vicar mouse, a jockey, an angler, a barrister complete with wig, and all in all about thirty-five to forty different specimens. Each was dressed in authentic dress, there was an 'Arsenal' football strip, an undertaker in frock coat and pin stripes, a ballerina dress, and each carried some symbol of his (Or her) calling, such as a pitch-fork, fishing rod, household tools etc: The dressing and machining was absolutely exquisite and Mr Kearsey told us of the trouble she goes to in finding the right materials for the costumes, and all the tiny buckles and buttons and other accessories, many of which she makes herself out of balsa wood, papier-mache, (moulded for a policeman's helmet) and all sorts of ingenious adaptions even down to studs for football boots. With the planning and design and fitting of the clothing the average time taken to make one figure is about a week, and her little mice are much sought after and can be found in many homes in many parts of the world. The audience was almost spellbound by the wonderful array, and the lecture table resembled a craft exhibition. Altogether a very interesting and unique entertainment.

The refreshments that followed were provided by Mr & Mrs White in celebration of their forty-eighth wedding anniversary which fell on that day, and were much appreciated by all present. Congratulations Ken and Peggy. The raffle was then drawn and a very happy and successful afternoon came to a close.
