

NOTICE FROM THE CHURCHWARDENS OF BADSEY

Some people have asked about plans for the appointment of a new vicar, following the retirement of the Revd. Peter Mitchell on 20th February but, unfortunately, we are unable to provide any precise information.

The Church Commissioners have published a draft scheme for Pastoral Reorganisation which, if approved, will separate Badsey with Aldington from Wickhamford (after about 400 years), then join Wickhamford with Broadway and, finally, create a new united benefice of Badsey with Aldington, and Offenham, and Bretforton. Assuming that no objections are raised, we are advised by the Archdeacon of Worcester that the scheme could be finalised within 3 to 4 months, following which the search for a new vicar of the 3 parishes will begin. He (or she) will live at Badsey Vicarage.

Meanwhile, we are pleased to welcome the Revd. Eric Waterhouse, a retired priest living at Evesham, who will be taking some of the services at Badsey during the Interregnum, as will our Reader, John Callaghan. Mr Waterhouse will officiate at weddings, funerals and baptisms. He is also available for pastoral care and may be contacted at 7 Hazel Avenue, Evesham telephone 421312.

Preparation of new Church Electoral Roll, 1996 - Badsey

The preparation of the new Church Electoral Roll for Badsey with Aldington will take place on Tuesday, 26th March and new application forms are being sent to all those already on the present roll from 19th February onwards. Parishioners are reminded that the latest date for application forms to be received for inclusion on the new roll is Friday, 22nd March.

MOTHERS' UNIONS

We made a good start with a happy and informative meeting for the first one in 1996. Our speaker was Mrs Ingrid Chestnutt of 'Social Concern' who gave us so much to absorb on how the MU works, its aims, what is achieved etc.

PARENTING COURSES had got off the ground. "What can a parent do?" is often the cry when teenagers are in difficulties. This basic course is mainly about communication techniques which is

where trouble so often begins.

MARRIAGE - Do we help our youngsters to have realistic expectations of marriage? Again communication is so important. CARAVAN - There is now sufficient cash in the Francis Samuel Memorial Fund to buy a new six berth caravan to be sited at Harvington as at present. There will be a new coordinator for visitors, cleaning rotas etc. our help is as vital as ever. CARBON MONOXIDE - M.U. has backed the appeals for legislation to force landlords to have safety checks on all gas appliances before renting out rooms, flats or property. This to reduce the number of fatalities from carbon monoxide poisoning, due to faulty heaters and/or cookers.

FLEET STREET - Crime is news, but it does seem to have got out of all proportion. M.U. is aware of this and is making our

views known.

PRISONS - Help goes on at prisons to give fathers opportunity to play with their children at visiting times. Toys, crayons and paper, paints, books are provided. In Worcs. M.U. is very active - and much appreciated - at Blakenhurst. 1995 gave the highest number of prisoners in any one year, the number is expected to rise. Half of all the people remanded do not receive a prison sentence, but they need help to manage their anger and violence. The lack of adequate compensation to victims is also a source of concern. HELP THE AGED - Our opinion was taken into account when extra VAT was proposed on fuel, eventually the Government's proposal was overturned. We also spoke on behalf of 16,000 war widows who have now had their pensions restored.

FINANCE - M.U. helps with drop-in centres for the homeless, much good work is done at Birmingham Bullring, in conjunction with police and other services.

MESSAGE HOME - This service continues and has proved a blessing to many parents whose children have gone missing. There are about 100,000 children and/or teenagers reported missing each year.

We should be proud of our Mothers Union and the good work we do. Our opinion is sought by the Government on urban, rural and overseas issues. We are regarded as a group of women striving to maintain stable family life, whose views can be relied upon.
