

My Dear Friends.

When I first came to take services at Badsey Church there were snowdrops and primroses in the churchyard; and, now the leaves are falling from the trees. Spring has come and gone, so has summer, and now winter

The Church's calendar calls the first day of November "All Saints' Day"; and November 2nd "All Souls' Day". On All Saints' Day we give thanks for all the Saints we do not know by name. We know the names of St. James, St. Peter and St. John, St. Richard of Chichester, St. Egwin of Evesham, St. Francis and many others. But there are many many more saints whom we do not know by name, and these we remember on All Saints' Day.

All Souls' Day is the day we remember people who have died. We remember people of our own families, friends and neighbours, who have died. We thank God for their lives and entrust them afresh to His care in eternity. When we remember them we keep them alive in our minds and think how they have helped us in our journey through this life.

When Saint Paul addressed his letters to various Churches – at Rome, Corinth, Ephesus etc: he addressed them as those whom God had called to be His Saints, that is, God's chosen people. You and I have been called to be God's Saints and thus to follow in the steps of His Son Jesus. We fail often but we can help one another; and God helps us, through prayer and worship and the sacraments of the Church.

There were so many people who were just like us; who failed often in their lives but, with God's help, they persevered and in the end have come face to face with God Himself.

There are Saints whom we know by name in the Church's Calendar and those whom we have met in our own lives.

As we give thanks for all the Saints, and remember all the departed, we are encouraged by their examples and go forward with renewed hope.
