It is quite unusual for this newsletter to be able to report on events which are right up-to-date. However, I am writing today, 24th February, less than twenty-four hours after returning from a Church Partnership visit to the eastern part of Germany (the former DDR). Eight of us went on the visit, staying with families in one of our Partnership villages of Kroppenstedt. Our ages ranged from three, eight, and fourteen up to my own age and we spent five nights and four days exploring life in a part of Europe which has a very different history to our own.

Whenever we go somewhere which is different or have a different sort of experience, the things which we learn from these events often only emerge over a period of time - days, weeks, months or perhaps years. However, the initial reaction of the group to this visit was of the kindness and generosity which we received from people who, by our standards, are by no means well-off.

One of the dangers of any new experience is that we quite rightly learn about other people and other things, but that we forget to ask what we have learnt about ourselves. As I said at the final meeting on Tuesday night, the two most important things about the partnership are what we learn about each other and what we learn about ourselves: about our ideas, what makes us tick, what motivates us and actually, who we really are.

Discovering who we really are is very important but it can also be quite threatening because we can be afraid that we will not like what we find. Yet self discovery is an important part of what it is to be human and what it is to be made in God's image. Indeed, the ability to ask the question and to try to answer it is what distinguishes us from other animals.

Wednesday the eighth of March marks the beginning of Lent. Lent is the season above all when we are called to embark on a journey of self-discovery and to ask the questions of who we really are. But who we really are is not just about looking inside ourselves. It actually concerns the whole world, our place in that world and the way in which our journey of self-discovery can assist other people in making that same journey for themselves.


