# St James, Badsey with Aldington Parish Newsletter September 2003

Its a real question and the issue at stake is as follows. Far too often we wish our lives away. When we are children we wish that it could be Christmas or our birthday. We want it to be a future time when we think that we will be happier than we are in the present. As we grow older, so we begin to realise that if we carry on in this way, then we will be old before we know it and we will have missed out on the possibilities of a good part of our life. Whilst I look forward to my holidays, I try to avoid wishing my life away in the process. As a result, when I have to try and imagine this article being read in early September, as the children return to school and the Church starts thinking about harvest festivals, it seems as though I am wishing my life away.

When I move on to ask the question as to what God makes about all of this, then the answer depends, of course, on how we understand God. The Christian understanding has a God who acts interacts with the world and with its time-frame in two different ways.

On the one hand, God interacts into time from outside time. God sees the whole picture all at once. He does not have to look forward to the future because he can already see what we are making of it. He does not wish his life away because he is outside time.

On the other hand, God acts within time and progresses through time along with us. He reveals Himself to us through the changing patterns of human history, the history of the world and the history of the universe. Just because He can look in, from outside time, it does not follow that he can miss out on the bits which he does not like. God is the God of history as much as He is the God who transcends anything which we can possibly imagine. God can stand back and see the whole picture.

Sometimes, we too have to stand back in order to try to see the whole picture. We have to try to place the events around us in their wider perspective; we have to see their significance for other people and for the future as well as for our own desires in the short term. Sometimes our own wishes have to play second fiddle to the wider need.

I hope that we all made the most of August, I also hope that every one of us makes the most of every single day during September.




