First school Governors bid farewell to Chairman

Governors of Badsey First School getting a taste of the outdoor life at Knowle Hill

The Governors of Badsey First School had a tranquil, woodland setting for their last meeting of the academic year. Not for them a cup of coffee in the school staff-room, whilst considering the school budget, but instead a glass of wine around a camp-fire at Knowle Hill. Undeterred by the fact that the heatwave of the previous few weeks threatened to break, the Governors thoroughly enjoyed their unusual venue in the company of pheasants and rabbits, and a cat who came to see what was going on. For a few brief moments, an umbrella was raised, the crisps got slightly wet, and the Clerk's notepad became rain-splattered, but thankfully the rain held off,

This jolly setting for the meeting had a two-fold purpose. The first was to bid farewell to Dr Peter Phillips, Chairman of Governors, who is leaving Badsey for a twoyear posting to the States. Peter first became a Governor at Badsey in 1997 when his daughter, Gina, started in Reception. The following year he was appointed Chairman, a role he has held until the present day. Head Teacher, Elizabeth Spencer, thanked Peter for all his support over the years, and wished him and all the family a happy time in America. Peter replied that it had been a privilege to be Chairman of such a well-run and forward-looking school. There were many things that he would miss, but mostly he would miss the school "with the intelligent twinkle in its eyes".

The second reason for the venue was to learn about Forest Schools. During the past year, four staff at Badsey have received Forest School training and a site for the Forest School has been developed on a private piece of land at Knowle Hill.

HOME & GARDEN

Gardening for September

Gather French and runner beans regularly and never leave any pods on the plants to become old and stringy unless they are required for seed purposes.

Spring bulbs can be planted in the garden now, with the exception of tulips. On average, plant bulbs at twice their own depth.

Prune out the flowered canes of loganberries and tie up the new ones, evenly spaced out. As the season ends, this again is a good time to move or plant evergreens. Soak 24 hours beforehand, and water well after planting. Choose a dull day.

Water Christmas cacti after their summer rest. Bring in houseplants from the garden before the frosts.

Begin to lift and store potatoes. Maincrop carrots and beetroot should also be stored, or the roots will become woody and crack.

If your garden is short of colour, notice how many perennials can be at their best this month, e.g.. Anemone japonica, Sedum "Autumn Joy" and Rudbeckia "Goldsturm".

Watch for aphids, which can still be a problem.

RECIPE CLUB: Pasta

Here are a few ideas for quick but tasty pasta dishes. In each case, amounts of ingredients depend on taste and numbers being catered for.

Chicken and rosemary. Roast a free range chicken and leave to rest while you cook the pasta. Saute some garlic in a little olive oil with some chopped rosemary and stir into the cooked pasta, before adding the chopped meat from the chicken and enough of its juices to create a thin sauce. Sprinkle with fresh parsley before serving with crusty bread and a green salad. This is a dish that goes a long way!

Gnocci with blue cheese. Gnocci is a robust pasta made from potato flour. Cook the gnocci according to the packet instructions and then set aside to keep warm, while you gently melt some blue cheese and a little cream in a pan to create a thin sauce. Serve immediately.

Saute some chopped bacon in a little olive oil until golden brown and then add a few chopped sage leaves and lots of freshly ground black pepper. Stir into freshly cooked penne or macaroni.

The cups and trophies were presented early, watched by a surprisingly large number of cheerful Flower Show supporters, after which the exhibits were dismantled, some of them in a rather damp state.

However, thanks go to all the judges, stewards and helpers and everyone who turned up in support. What will next year bring? Come and see on 28 July 2007.


