On February 22nd it was the first anniversary of Mike and I taking over the Post Office at Offenham. We had taken the reins of the shop the previous Saturday. The year has certainly been enjoyable and we have been made to feel most welcome.

An anniversary is the date of an event in a previous year. Every year we all celebrate at least one anniversary – our birthday. Others may celebrate a wedding anniversary, with some years marking particular milestones, or the anniversary of a memorable date such as retirement, or the death of a loved one.

This year 2007, no doubt sees the anniversaries of many historical events but I would like to highlight one particular happening. March 25th 2007 marks the bicentenary of the Parliamentary Act to abolish the slave trade in the British Colonies. Two hundred years later we celebrate the life, vision and work of the Christian Politician, William Wilberforce, who was the driving force behind the passing of the Act despite the opposition. However, whilst it is right that we celebrate the legal abolition we need to acknowledge that slavery still exists. The Act of Abolition is only a step on the long journey to build a better world.

Slavery is the theme of our benefice Lenten Course this year (more information about that elsewhere). Lent is one of the many anniversaries of the Christian Calendar, which starts with the anniversary of Ash Wednesday, preceded by Shrove Tuesday, or as it is better known today, Pancake Day. Lent, the period from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday before Easter Sunday, is the start of the most important anniversary in the Christian Calendar. The weekend when we remember how Jesus died on the cross to save mankind and then rose again and in doing so fulfilled his promise of eternal life.

Anniversaries are often occasions when we not only remember but also reflect. Mike and I are reflecting on our first anniversary in the shop; what has happened in the last year, where are we now and how do we want to develop. The six weeks of Lent leading to Holy Week are a wonderful opportunity to reflect on our relationship with God. Where we may have been in the past, where we possibly are now, and where we may hope to go in the future...
