
FROM THE ARCHIVES

Over the years many parishioners have sat on the hexagonal plinth of the cross in the churchyard, or used it as a vantage point for photographing newly-weds leaving the church. Some believe it to have been erected as a war memorial. But this year, the cross celebrates its centenary. Its story begins on January 24th 1910 with a letter from Julius Sladden to the vicar, Rev. W.C. Allsebrook, "My dear Vicar, in October next we shall reach, the 25th anniversary of the re-opening of our Parish Church after restoration and enlargement. It seems to me a fitting period to erect some permanent memorial to the then Vicar, the Rev. T. H. Hunt, for the conspicuous part he took in that great work. I think the re-erection of our Churchyard Cross would be a fitting monument and if you concur, as I believe you do, would you take an early opportunity of calling a meeting of all those interested in the matter to discuss what can be done ?"

The Vicar was in hearty agreement with Mr. Sladden's suggestion, and arranged a meeting in the Parish Room to discuss his proposal on Valentine's Day in the hope that there would be a good muster, not only of Mr. Hunt's old friends, but also of others who are today reaping the benefit of Mr. Hunt's zeal and liberality. (The Parish Room was a large stone-flagged room with fixed benches around its walls. It was part of the old vicarage which stood on the site now occupied by Allsebrook Gardens.)

The meeting cordially endorsed the proposal to restore the ancient Churchyard Cross in memory of the Rev. T. H. Hunt. A committee was appointed, consisting of Miss M. Byrd, Miss E. Sladden, and Messrs. E. Crisp, A. Dore, A. E. Jones, J. W. Mason and W. Mustoe, to act with the Vicar and Churchwardens with a view to giving effect to such proposal. Miss E. Sladden was appointed secretary and the Vicar was asked to act as treasurer. Subscriptions amounting to nearly £10 were promised, and Mr. A. E. Jones said he hoped the sum collected would provide not only for the restoration of the old cross but also for the erection of a memorial tablet in the church. This will mean the expenditure of between £40

and £50 at least. contributions towards which may be sent either to the treasurer or the secretary. Mr. T. Graham Jackson. R.A.. was asked to prepare suitable design.



So on the afternoon of Saturday 15th October the graceful Churchyard Cross, erected to the memory of the late Rev. T. H. Hunt, was dedicated by the Archdeacon of Warwick with simple but impressive ceremonial. The dedication was preceded by evensong. with special lessons and psalms. Captains Cecil and Charles Hunt were both in the choir, the former reading the first lesson and the Rural Dean the second. "O Saviour of the world," was sung by the choir without accompaniment before the choir and clergy led the way to the cross. The service in the churchyard was conducted by the Archdeacon, and after the dedication the hymn " When I survey" was sung as all stood round the cross. On returning to the church the Archdeacon preached an appropriate sermon, and the service concluded with the singing of "Abide with me" and the blessing.

In the evening there was a Social Gathering in the Old School, at which Capts. Cecil and Chas. Hunt and Mrs. Chas. Hunt were accorded a most hearty reception. The big room was packed and everybody seemed in the best of good humour with everybody else. The Vicar, in welcoming the principal guests, said how deeply he appreciated all that Mr. Hunt had done for the village and people of Badsey, and he was glad that the gratitude of Badsey had at length taken a practical turn. A musical programme kept the company entertained to a late hour and, but for the fact that Sunday was so near, it would probably have been a case of an "all-night sitting"

COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS CHALLENGE

David and I are Friends of Pax Lodge - a world centre run by the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts, whose members in 148 countries help raise money and change lives. In the lead up to 100 years of Girl Guiding UK, you will have been reading in the village magazine how the Rainbows, Brownies, Guides, Senior Section and Leaders in Badsey and its surrounds have been helping to "Change the World and Make a Difference."

The challenge sheet was shown to the Church Council, and it was agreed that it would be used during Lent to help raise money for WaterAid. This had been one of the Brownies chosen charities, whose mission is to overcome poverty by enabling the world's poorest people to gain access to safe water, sanitation and hygiene education.

The 40 days preceding Easter Sunday and the resurrection of Jesus Christ are known as Lent and hold significant meaning in the Christian faith. Preparation may include prayer, fasting, almsgiving or other sacrifices. This year Lent starts on Wednesday 17 February through to Saturday 03 April 2010.

You don't need to be a member of St James to take part.

The challenge sheet only asks you to count your blessings during a 28 day period of your choice during Lent.

For example:

Day 1 – Think about how you may use your time wisely today. Give 1p for every clock in your home.

Day 2 – Many people around the world need to collect and burn wood for energy. Give 1p for every gas/electric appliance in your kitchen.

Day 3 – Even candles are a luxury for some people. Give 1p for every light switch in your house.

At the end of the period, count up your blessings, and give the amount of money you have raised to the church who will forward it to WaterAid. It can be given to any church member or contact the vicar or Sue Cole for details. If lots of us take part, it will be surprising how quickly all those pennies will add up to help make a difference. So why don't you give the challenge a go! You can collect your challenge sheets from the back of church or from the Spar Shop






